July 20. Licence, for 10 marks to be paid to the king by Roger de Otery, clerk,  
Westminster. for the alienation in mortmain by him to John de Neubold, chaplain  
of the chantry at the altar of St. Mary in Kemeseye church, of four  
messuages and two virgates of land in Norton by Worcester.

July 13. Licence, for 12 marks to be paid to the king by William Teynturer  
Westminster. of Salisbury, the elder, for the alienation in mortmain by him to the  
dean and chapter of the church of St. Mary, Salisbury, of two  
messuages in Salisbury, to find a chaplain to celebrate divine service  
daily according to his ordinance for the souls of the faithful departed.

July 15. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by the king's clerk David de  
Westminster. Wollore and Michael de Ravendale, clerk, to John de Brampton,  
parson of the church of St. Dunstan West in Fletstrete in the suburb  
of London, of a messuage in the parish of St. Dunstan West, held of  
the king in free burgage, as has been found by inquisition taken by  
John Pecche, mayor and escheator of London, for a manse for the  
rector of the said church. By K.

July 23. Licence for the prior and convent of Drax to crenellate their church  
Westminster. and belfry. By K.

Aug. 20. Licence for the alienation in mortmain to the abbot and convent  
Windsor. of Whalleye, in satisfaction of 10*l.* of 20*l.* yearly of land and rent  
which they had the late king's licence to acquire of the following  
messuages and lands which are of the clear yearly value of 6*l.* 7*s.* 2*d.*,  
as has been found by divers inquisitions made by William de Nessefeld,  
escheator in the county of Lancaster :—

by Richard de Coldecotes, chaplain, John de Croenton, chaplain,  
and William de Lyndelay, thirteen messuages, 126 acres of  
land, 26 acres of meadow and 42 acres of pasture, in Cliderhowe,  
Wadyngton, Great Penhulton and Dutton, and

by John de Gristewayt, vicar of the church of Blakeburn, John  
de Toppeclif, late vicar of the church of Whalleye, Robert de  
Stones, Henry de Eccleshull, William de Whalleye and Adam  
de Enwode, fifteen messuages, a toft, 20 acres of land and  
4 acres of meadow, in Cliderhowe, Blakeburn and Wlipshire.

Westminster.

(1) Dated 18 May, 14 Edward III [*Calendar, 1338-1340, p. 521*],  
in favour of John de Sutton super Trentam and Margaret,  
his wife.

(2.) Dated 20 May, 14 Edward III [*Ibid.*], granting licence for  
John son of John de Sutton super Trentam to enfeoff Nicholas  
de la Beche of the manor of Bradefeld, co. Berks.

(3.) Dated 22 June, 14 Edward III [*Ibid.*], *p. 550*, granting  
licence for the said Nicholas to make a settlement of the said  
manor of Bradefeld.

Although the said manor, by pretext of an inquisition taken before  
William de Wykham and Robert de Belknap whereby it was found  
that the said John de Sutton super Trentam held it of the king in  
chief and enfeoffed his son John thereof in the fourteenth year without
