and many of their confederacy, fearing that Richard would reveal this to the king and council, followed him to the church of Kirketon, assaulted him in the church and left him for dead ; and that they with the said bailiffs and the bailiffs of the wapentake of Kirketon ejected the said Richard from the farm which he had of the prior of St. John of Jerusalem in England out of the churches of Kirketon and Donyngton in Holand, drove away 5 horses, 3 cows, 50 swine and 60 sheep of his worth 20 marks, and carried away his goods.
