William Cok, John Aleyn, Walter Thacchere, Richard Catour, William, his son, Robert Salfyn, Henry Sekelyng, Alan Cokill, John Sadelere, Thomas Osebern, John atte Madewe, John Skynnere, Alan atte Brok, John Deyngue, William Seyntlowe, Robert de Brigham, John, his brother, John Avenel, Warin de Bassyngbourn and others, imprisoned him at Histon, co. Cambridge, and carried away 19*l.* of his in money by tale. For 20*s.* paid in the hanaper.

Oct. 26. The like to John de la Lee, 'chivaler,' John Bataill, Walter de Westminster. Aldebury, Roger de Herlaston, John de Bampton and John Quynyld, in the county of Suffolk, touching evildoers who carried away a whale (*cete*) and other royal fish, pertaining to Queen Philippa of the king's grant, at Ipswich and in the neighbourhood.

Feb. 16. The like to John de Moubray, Thomas de Ingelby, Richard de Westminster. Tounleye, John de Pudesay and Robert de Horneby, touching armed evildoers who entering the abbey of Whalley, co. Lancaster, of the foundation of the king's progenitors, the monks whereof are charged with masses, prayers and other works of piety for the king in return for possessions conferred on them by the said progenitors, and divers manors thereof, besieged the monks in their church, cloister and houses, and by threats disturbed them so that for a long time they have not done these prayers or works of piety, and assaulted the abbot's men and servants, wounded some, drove others from the abbey and manors, took away others, compelled them to serve some of them, and have prevented those taken away and those left behind from cultivating the abbot's land for a great time, and hunted in the abbot's warrens and carried away hares, conies, pheasants and partridges. For 20*s.* paid in the hanaper.

Feb. 3. Commission to William de Shareshull and the sheriff of Stafford, Westminster. reciting that whereas it was lately found by inquisition taken after the death of John de Bromley, who held in chief, that he held at his death a third part of the manor of Assheleye, co. Stafford, of the king in chief by knight service and the manor of Bromleye of another, that he died on Monday after the Assumption, in the twenty-second year, and that Alice his daughter of the age of half a year and more was his next heir, the king is now given to understand that he held many more lands in the county at his death, to wit 20 marks yearly of land in Blymenhull in a place called Brokhurst, 4 marks yearly of rent in Podemore, 20*s.* yearly of rent in a place called Le Gorstihull, 12*s.* yearly of rent in Ruge, and 4*s.* yearly of rent in Chatculne, not contained in the inquisition; and appointing them to make an exact inquisition of the lands and rents.

Feb. 20. Mandate to all mayors, sheriffs, bailiffs, ministers and the bailiffs Westminster. and good men of Pencrich and others to take the bodies of all persons prosecuting appeals in foreign parts touching collations of prebends in the king's free chapel of Pencrich, which are conferred by the king or by the dean of the chapel and by none other; and commit them to prison in the keeping of the sheriff of the county of Stafford.
