Commission of oyer and terminer to John de la Lee, steward of the Westminster. household, Robert de Thorpe, Richard de Ravenser, John Knyvet and William de Fyncheden, on complaint by Simon, bishop of Ely, the chancellor, who is constantly attendant upon the affairs of the king and the realm and, with his men, lands and possessions, is under the king's special protection, that John Dengayne, 'chivaler,' and others, carried away his goods at Cantebrigg, while he was attendant upon the affairs aforesaid, and assaulted his servant Philip Norman there. June 17. Commission of oyer and terminer to Robert de Thorpe, John Knyvet, Westminster. Edmund de Chelreya and Michael de Skillyng, on information that whereas William, bishop of Winchester, who by the king's mandate is constantly occupied with others of the council about the direction of affairs of the king and realm, and with his men, lands, rents and possessions is for that cause under the king's special protection, sent by his men and servants a cart of his laden with treasure, victuals and other goods to his manor of Witteneye for the sustenance of himself and his household, a large number of evildoers arrested the cart on the highway at Donyngton, co. Berks, and the men and servants leading the cart, with the horses in it, assaulted the men, and chased them from the cart and the bishop lost many of the said goods so left derelict without guard. June 8. Commission to Thomas, earl of Oxford, John de Sutton, 'le piere,' Vestminster. John de Bampton and Robert de Naillynghirst, clerk, to make inquisition in the county of Essex touching evildoers who assaulted Thomas Peronel, one of the king's mariners, at Manytre (*as on m. 9d*), and touching any forestalleries, and merchandise liable to customs exported not customed or cocketed; and to cause those indicted
