June 17. Commission of oyer and terminer to Robert de Thorpe, John Knyvet, Westminster. Edmund de Chelreye and Michael Skillyng, on complaint by William, bishop of Winchester, that Richard de Badberbury, 'chivaler,' Thomas, his brother, John Wildeknave, 'hayward,' and others arrested a cart of his laden with treasure, victuals, and other goods for his manor of Wytteneye on the highway at Donyngton, co. Berks (*as on the preceding membrane*). By K.

June 17. Commission to William Halden, William Wauer, Thomas Everard, Westminster. and Nicholas atte Crouche, reciting that because the walls of the city of Canterbury are for the most part fallen on account of old age and the stones thereof carried away, and the ditches under the walls are obstructed; and the citizens now propose to repair the walls and cleanse the ditches, praying the king to give order for the removal of houses and buildings and the enclosures of gardens erected so near the walls within and without and upon and near the ditches that the walls cannot conveniently be repaired and erected without their removal; the king has appointed them to make inquisition by the oath of good men of the said city and other parts of the county of Kent for the names of those who have carried away the stones, the quantity taken, by what authority taken, and their value, as well as of those who have erected the buildings to the nuisance of the repair of the wall otherwise than was done of ancient time and by what authority. June 20. Commission of oyer and terminer to Robert de Thorpe, John Westminster. Knyvet, Richard Walkfare and John Cosyn, on complaint by the king's son John, duke of Lancaster, that some evildoers broke his closes and houses at Gymyngham, Tunstede, Methewold, Tetteford and Swefham, co. Norfolk, entered his free warrens there, and hunted in these, felled his trees, fished in his several fisheries, digged in his several turbaries, and carried away the turves thrown out thereof and his fish, trees, timber from his houses and other goods, as well as hares, conies, pheasants and partridges from the warrens, trode down and depastured with cattle his crops and grass there, rescued cattle taken by his bailiffs and ministers by the name of distraint or to be impounded according to law the custom of the realm and assaulted his men and servants. June 20. The like to Robert de Thorpe, John Knyvet, Edmund de Alderford, Westminster. and William de Bliklyngge, on complaint by the said duke that Thomas Gerveys of Eston, William Curson of Berford, Thomas Baliolf, John Dunnyng, Walter Underwode and others arrested a horse of his loaded with goods to the value of 200*l.* at Norwich, carried away the goods and assaulted his men and servants, and maliciously imprisoned them straitly bound with chains.
