Jan. 7. Pardon to John le Parchmyner of Covyntre of the king's suit for
Woodstock. the death of William Davyntre, 'dubbar,' and of any consequent
outlawry; as the king is informed that he killed him in self defence.

Jan. 18. Grant, for life or until other order, to John Wyght, the younger,
Windsor. of an annuity of 5 marks at the exchequer. By p.s.

Jan. 16. Pardon to Edmund de Wolfreton of Warrewyk, detained in
Westminster. Warrewyk gaol for the death of Thomas Scot of Warrewyk, of the
king's suit for that death; as the king has learned by the record
of Fulk de Bermyngham and his fellows, justices of oyer and terminer
in the county of Warwick, that he killed him in self defence.

Jan. 20. William Fifhide, staying in Ireland on the king's service in the
Westminster. company of William de Wyndesore, has letters nominating William
Tauk and Richard Elbrigg as his attorneys in England for one year.
David de Wollore received the attorneys.

Jan. 22. Grant to the king's clerk John de Ravenser of the prebend which
Westminster. John de Hermesthorp lately held in the king's free chapel of
St. Stephen in Westminster palace. By p.s.

Jan. 20. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Henry de Percy to the
Westminster. prior and convent of Neuburgh of a toft and 8 acres, or one bovate,
of land in Folifait, held of the king in chief by knight service, in

10 acres of land which are of the endowment of the priory and held

Beckley. king's lieutenant in Ireland, and for good service done in the king's
wars in the duke's company, to Thomas de Achesley, chaplain, of
the king's suit for the death of Roger de Pulesdon, whereof he is
indicted or appealed, and of any consequent outlawry. By p.s.

Jan. 22. Licence for Anne late the wife of Edward le Despenser to enfeoff
Westminster. John de Gretteford of Cherleby and John Calke, parson of the church
of Wyntrelewe, of a moiety of the manor of Burghle, co. Rutland,
said to be held in chief; and for them to grant the same to her for
life, with remainder to her son Thomas le Despenser, 'chivaler,'
