April 16. Commission to John de Bromwych, 'chivaler,' Edmund Dunclent, Westminster. William Barber and John Selby to arrest and bring honourably before the king, to be delivered to the justices of the King's Bench, William Adams, clerk, who against the king's proclamation and prohibition went to foreign parts without licence, sued there many processes of felony, trespasses and other misdeeds, which should be determined within the realm by the king's court, and has brought the said processes into the realm to put them in execution, to the contempt and prejudice of the king and the manifest peril of the disherison of the crown, with the said processes and other things prejudicial to the king and people.

April 20. Commission to the king's serjeants at arms, Walter de Leycestre Westminster. and Richard Imworth, to arrest and bring before the council Robert Eustace of Tilney, chaplain, who is purposing, as the king has heard, to go to foreign parts to prosecute many things prejudicial to the king and his crown.

May 1. Commission to John de Bampton, William Hervy and Nicholas Westminster. Bodewell to make inquisition in the county of Berks touching chattels of felons and fugitives, escheats, wards, marriages, waif and stray, pertaining to Queen Philippa, by reason of her lordship and liberty in the country, as the king is informed that many of these are concealed and detained by her ministers and others.

May 6. Commission to John de Boys, Thomas de Fulnetby, Ralph de Redford, Westminster. William Wascelyn, William Bray and John de Amcotes to survey the water of Ancolne and the weirs and sewers running thereto from a place called Bisshopbriggess, co. Lincoln, to the water of Humbre, which are now so narrowed and obstructed that the whole country on both sides of the said water is flooded, and to find by inquisition who are bound to cleanse the said water, weirs and sewers, and to compel such, by distrains and amercements, to do so. May 16. Commission of the peace, pursuant to the statutes of Winchester, Westminster. Northampton and Westminster, to Edward le Despencer, Gilbert Talbot, Walter Deveros, Robert Palet and John Sloughtre, in the county of Gloucester.
