May 16. Commission to Guy de Briane and John Chideok, reciting that
Westminster. whereas the king lately appointed them to make inquisition in the
county of Dorset touching malefactors who entered a ship of Richard
de Preston, called *la Michel* of London, which was driven ashore by the
violence of the sea near Weymouth on its passage to the parts of Aquit-
taine, and took away therefrom goods of the king's clerk, Master John de
Stretleye, then chancellor of Edward, prince of Aquitaine and Wales,
and they returned in such inquisition that the ship was broken on a
'rok' and sunk, the king has now learned on behalf of the said John,
that, after the sinking of the ship, many of his goods on the ship came
to land and were carried away by men of those parts and are still
detained from him, and he has appointed them to make inquisition
in the county of Dorset what goods came to land, and when and by
whom they were carried away.

May 18. Association of William Fairfax in the late commission of oyer and
Westminster. terminer to Henry Percy, Thomas de Ingelby, John de Cavendissh and
John de Bentele, touching felonies and trespasses committed by John de
Gerwardby in the county of York; the said John de Bentele being
too ill to act.
