Whereas the king by letters patent lately granted licence (1) for the rector and brethren of Edyndon to acquire lands, rents and advowsons to the value of 30*l.* yearly, and to appropriate the churches; and (2) for Robert Gundewyn and William atte Chaumbre to assign in mortmain to the said rector and brethren the manor of Hyweye, co.
