Dec. 1. Commission to John Alast, coroner in the parts of Kesteven, co. Westminster. Lincoln, Ralph West of Gretford and Roger Penereth of Baston, to arrest and deliver to the Marshalsea prison John Ropere of Langtoft, outlawed in the county of Lincoln for non-appearance to answer touching the death of John Herde, of which he was appealed before the king by Emma, late the wife of the said John, who has been indicted of that death before Gilbert de Umframvill and his fellows, justices of oyer and terminer in the said county, and that indictment remains before the king, he having become a vagabond in the said county, threatening his indictors and the said Emma and perpetrating much damage to others.

Jan. 24. Commission to Thomas de Gray, Alan de Heton, Robert de Hagerston Westminster. and David Gray, reciting that it is well known in the parts of Northumberland and not unknown to them that John de Clifford, enemy and rebel of the king, has been brought to the castle of Bamburgh with his household under the care and secret leading of men of that county and elsewhere to treasonably take and steal the said castle by their aid and counsel, and has disposed his party with his whole force for this end; and appointing them to make inquisition in that county touching the premises, and to pursue, arrest and keep in the prison of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, until further order, all persons concerned therein.
