Westminster. in the county of Essex for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer Robert le Bret in a plea that he render him an account of the time during which he was his receiver; he having now surrendered to the Flete prison as Robert de Thorpe, chief justice, has certified.
- Oct. 21. Pardon to Thomas Crau, 'chapman,' of the king's suit for the  
Westminster. death of Hugh de Haynton, 'shipman'; the king having learned by the record of Thomas de Ingelby and his fellows, justices appointed to deliver the gaol of Lincoln castle, that he killed him in self-defence.
- Oct. 23. Pardon to William Doget of his outlawry in the county of Cambridge  
Westminster. for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer the king and John Bataille touching a contempt and trespass done by him against the form of the ordinance of labourers; he having now surrendered to the Flete prison as Robert de Thorpe, chief justice, has certified.
- Oct. 24. Thomas son of Fulk de Bermyngeham, 'chivaler,' going beyond  
Westminster. seas by the king's licence in the company of Edmund de Arundell, has letters nominating Fulk de Bermyngeham, 'chivaler,' and John Warner, clerk, as his attorneys in England for one year.
