John de Foxle, Roger de Elmrugge, Edmund de Chelreye, John de Evesham and John de Herdewyk, to keep the water of Thames between Henle and Rotecote, in the counties of Oxford and Berks, according to the said statute, to find by inquisitions the names of those who have put or erected weirs, palings, stanks and kiddles in that water, to survey all weirs, mills, stanks, palings and kiddles therein and to remove and completely thrown down all that have been erected since the time of Edward I. and obstruct the passage. By C.

July 25. Commission of oyer and terminer to William Latymer, steward of Westminster. the household, Thomas de Lodelowe and Nicholas de Carreu, touching all treasons, felonies and trespasses in the county of Middlesex.

July 18. Substitution of William de Wakebrugge and Philip Purefey in the Westminster. commission of oyer and terminer in the county of Leicester to John Knyvet, Thomas de Ingelby, Simon Pakeman and Richard de Leycestre on complaint of William Kyng against Richard Jamvill and others, in the place of the said Simon and Richard, whom the king has discharged from the same. By C.

The like substitution in the commission of oyer and terminer to the same on complaint by John son of William Kyng against Richard Jamvill and others.

July 26. Commission to the abbots of Shrouesbery and Wenlok, Thomas de Westminster. Ilston, Philip de Lutteleye and Thomas de Glasele to make a visitation of the king's free chapel of Bruggenorth and its members, in which, as the king is given to understand, there are many defects in the books, vestments and other ornaments, as well as in the manses, houses and other things pertaining to the deanery of the chapel in the county of Salop, since the time of Robert Ive, the last dean, in the presence of the king's clerk Thomas de Brantyngham, the treasurer, to whom the king has now given the deanery, or his attorney deputed for this, as well as of the executors of the will of the said Robert Ive or of those in whose hands his goods now are; also to find whether the latter wasted the goods and possessions of the deanery and whether any of his goods should have been left to the present dean, by the name of implement, according to the statutes or customs of the chapel, and to have sufficient goods for the correction of the defects of the chapel arrested and kept safely until further order.

July 26. Mandate to all admirals, keepers of ports, ministers and others to Westminster. permit John de Brampton, parson of the church of St. Dunstan West, London, who with the king's licence is going to the court of Rome to expedite some business specially affecting him, to pass without impediment.

June 14. Appointment of John de Northwode, Thomas de Hampton and Westminster. Robert Elys of Shepeye to array all men at arms, armed men, hobelers, archers and others of the island of Shepeye, to bring back all absent (*forinsecos*) men at arms, armed men, hobelers and archers having lands in the island who were accustomed to be arrayed therein
