Feb. 6. Commission to Godfrey Folejaumbe, Nicholas de Knyveton, Westminster. Nicholas Tissyngton and John de Knyveton to take John Haukyn of Aston, of the county of Berks, lately indicted of the death of John Clement, his master, before Roger de Mortuo Mari, late earl of March, and his fellows, then justices of oyer and terminer in the county of Kent, at Canterbury, who confessed before them that he had done that felony and on that account was delivered as a convicted clerk to the archbishop of Canterbury, ordinary of the place, according to the benefit of clergy, for chastisement, and afterwards broke out of the archbishop's prison and escaped, and stays in the county of Derby enriched with much goods; and to send him before the justices of the King's Bench to be delivered to the Marshalsea prison until he be delivered according to law and the custom of the realm; and to seize into the king's hand all the goods of the said John in the said county and in the county of Stafford, and, after having had them appraised, certify the king of the value.

Feb. 6. Commission to William Bussy, sheriff of Lincoln, on information Westminster. that many evildoers and disturbers of the peace, indicted and appealed of felonies as well before justices of oyer and terminer as before sheriffs, coroners and bailiffs, in the said county, have withdrawn from that county without justice having been done on them, and are vagabond in divers counties perpetrating much damage, to arrest all such as he shall find by inspection of indictments made before him and all other late sheriffs and others to have been indicted and not yet acquitted, and bring them to the gaol of Lincoln castle to be kept there until delivered according to law and the custom of the realm.
