Westminster. diocese of Bath and Wells, in the king's gift by reason of the alien priory of Stoke Courcy being in his hand on account of the war with France.

July 10. Revocation of the protection with clause *volumus*, for one year,
Westminster. lately granted to John de Florence and John Creapayn in the belief that they were going beyond seas on the king's service in the company of Edward le Despenser; as the sheriffs of London have certified that they have not gone but tarry in the said city.

July 8. The like of the protection for William Paly of Ast, Lumbard, as
Westminster. above.

July 10. Presentation of Henry le Hunt, parson of the church of Allesley,
Westminster. in the diocese of Coventry and Lichfield, to the vicarage of the church of Nunne Eton, in the same diocese, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the abbot of Lyre, alien, being in his hands on account of the war with France; on an exchange of benefices with Robert Ferour.

June 29. Presentation of Edward Forest, parson of the church of Terryng,
Westminster. of the immediate jurisdiction of the archbishop of Canterbury, to the church of Wetheryngsete, in the diocese of Norwich, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the bishopric of Ely; on an exchange of benefices with Master John Marcheford.
