- April 23. Pardon to Robert Clerk of Blaunkenay of the king's suit for the death of William de Billesfeld of Blaunkenay, miller, whereof he is indicted or appealed, and of any consequent outlawry. By p.s.
- June 14. Exemption for life of Robert Calf, knight, from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from appointment as mayor, sheriff, escheator, coroner, keeper of the peace, collector of subsidy, or other bailiff or minister of the king, against his will. By p.s.
- June 16. Pardon, at the supplication of the king's clerk, Guy de Rouclyf, to Edmund de Folyfayt of the king's suit for the death of John de Brandon, whereof he is indicted or appealed, and of any consequent outlawry. By p.s.
- June 15. Presentation of David Brounyng, chaplain, to the vicarage of the church of St. Clears, in the diocese of St. Davids, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the priory of St. Clears being in his hand on account of the war with France.
- July 6. Presentation of William de Rothelay to the church of Stretham, in the diocese of Winchester, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the alien priory of Okebourne being in his hand as above.
- June 20. Presentation of Alan de Godwynston, chaplain, to the chantry called 'la Doge,' Canterbury, of the jurisdiction exempt of the prior of St. Augustine's, Canterbury, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the abbey of St. Augustine's.
- June 24. Presentation of John son of John de Bottesford, chaplain, to the vicarage of the church of Cameryngham, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by reason of the alien priory of Cameryngham being in his hand on account of the war with France.

- June 8. *Inspeximus* and confirmation to the burgesses of Tenby of a charter of Laurence de Hastynges, late earl of Pembroke and lord of Wexford and Bergeveny, dated at Pembroke, 27 February, 16 Edward III, and witnessed by Sirs Hugh de Hastynges, Randolf de Hastynges, William de Hastynges, Thomas West, Oliver de Cervyngton, steward of his lands, knights, John de Bereford, steward of Pembroke and sheriff, Richard de Stakepole, Robert de Rupe, Owen ap Oweyn, John Joce, William Malenfant, Adam de Bocketon, clerk, and others, inspecting and confirming with additions a charter of Aymer de Valencia, earl of Pembroke and lord of Wexford and Montignac, dated in his manor of Wynneferthyng in Norfolk, 24 April, 16 Edward II, and witnessed by Sirs Constantine de Mortuo Mari, John de Nevill, steward of his lands, Richard de Monte Caniso, Robert Bendyn, Richard Symond, steward of Pembroke, Richard Stakepole, John Joce, knights, William Godman, sheriff of Pembroke, Walter Malenfant, Walter de Castro, Thomas de Castro Goderici, clerk, and others, inspecting and confirming with additions a charter of William de Valencia, earl of Pembroke, his father, and Joan the countess, his mother, witnessed by Roger de Woldesef, master of Slebech, Sirs Stephen de Edworth, steward of Pembroke, Robert de Valle,
