June 2. Exemption for life of John Buttourt, 'chivaler,' from being put

June 23. Presentation of John Cauchon to the church of Warton, of the
Windsor. immediate jurisdiction of the archdeaconry of Richmond, in the king's gift by reason of the keeping of the land and heir of Thomas de Thweng, who held in chief, being in his hand ; directed to Humphrey de Cherleton, archdeacon of Richmond. By p.s.

June 25. Presentation of John Tolethorp, parson of the church of Ikham,
Westminster. in the diocese of Canterbury, to the church of Whytchirche, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by reason of the keeping of the land and heir of Thomas de Veer, late earl of Oxford, who held in chief, being in his hand ; on an exchange of benefices with Walter Faryngdon.

June 20. Ratification, with the assent of William Tanny, prior of the hospital
Westminster. of St. John of Jerusalem in Ireland, chancellor of Ireland, of the estate of Thomas Ripperis as chaplain of the chantry in the chapel of the castle of Trym in Ireland and warden of the house of St. Mary Magdalen pertaining to the said chantry, by the collation of Edmund de Mortuo Mari, earl of March.

Dec. 28. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Robert Beleknappe,
Eltham manor. knight, of the manor of Sharstede by Roucestre, 23 acres of land, 80 acres of pasture and an acre of wood in Chetham and Woldeham, and a moiety of the manor of Lydesynge, whereof the manor of Sharstede (except 20 acres of land therein) is said to be held of the king by knight service as of the honour of Creveqoer, 8 acres of the king as of the honour of Leybourne, and the remainder of others, to the prior and convent of Roucestre, at a yearly rent of 22 marks, to find a monk to celebrate divine service daily in the cathedral church of the said prior and convent according to an ordinance to be made by Robert.

June 25. Whereas Henry de Erdynton lately acquired in fee a fourth part
Westminster. of the manor of Barwe upon Sore, held in chief, from Ralph Basset, and another fourth part of the same from John Lestraunge, and subsequently Giles de Erdyngton, deceased, entered into the manor without due process or livery in the king's court and enfeoffed William le Walssh, late parson of the church of Upton, and Thomas Wylde, chaplain, thereof, and the said feoffees afterwards granted the same to Giles and Elizabeth his wife for life, with remainder to Thomas, son of Giles, and Margaret his wife, in tail, and remainder over to Giles and his heirs and assigns, without the king's licence, and the manor was taken into the king's hand by the death of Elizabeth and
