April 30. Whereas Richard Cradok, clerk, and Margery late the wife of William Westminster. Blake of the county of Somerset, administrators of the goods of William Blake who died intestate, have been outlawed in the husting of London for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer Benedict de Gresby, clerk, touching a plea that they render 45s. 8d., and Richard has now surrendered to the Flete prison, as Robert Bealknap, chief justice, has certified; the king has pardoned his outlawry.

April 28. John Wattes, citizen of Bristol, staying in England, has letters Westminster. nominating John Pyk and Roger Palmer as his attorneys in Ireland for one year. Th. de Thelwall received the attorneys.

April 30. Grant to Robert de Belknap, knight, of the wardship of the lands Westminster. late of John de Leyhamme, who held in chief, which have come into the king's hand by the death of the said John while under age and in his ward, and by reason of the minority of his heir, with the marriage of the heir; and so from heir to heir. On condition that he keep the lands without waste and do and support the real services and other charges incumbent thereon. By p.s.

April 27. Pardon, at the supplication of Simon, archbishop of Canterbury, Westminster. to Richard Taillour of the king's suit for the death of John Penreth, whereof he is indicted or appealed, and of any consequent outlawry. By p.s.

Feb. 3. Presentation of John de Bouland to the church of Egemundon, in Westminster. the diocese of Coventry and Lichfield.

May 1. Ratification of the estate of Walter Cherchefeld as parson of the Westminster. church of St. Peter le Bailey (*in Ballio*), Oxford, in the diocese of Lincoln.

May 5. Licence for the prioress and nuns of Thefford to appropriate the Westminster. church of Little Lyvermere, in the diocese of Norwich, which is of their advowson and does not exceed the value of 10*l.* yearly. By p.s.

May 6. Grant to William Jod, chaplain, Thomas Akton and Henry Draper Westminster. of pontage for five years in aid of the repair of the bridge of Jarum upon Tese, which is broken down.

May 9. Presentation of Howel ap Jevan ap Howel, chaplain, to the church Westminster. of Rodery, in the diocese of Llandaff, in the king's gift by reason of his wardship of the land and heir of Edward le Despenser, knight, who held in chief.

May 1. Confirmation, for $\frac{1}{2}$ mark paid to the king by the king's clerk, John Westminster. Disseford, of a lease, dated 4 March last, by William Bardolf, lord of Wirmegeye, co. Norfolk, to the said John of the whole manor of Watton atte Stone, co. Hertford, with the water-mill, free warren and all other customs and appurtenances, and all lands, rents and services of tenants in the town of Stapelford (the advowson of the church of Stapelford and of the free chapel in Watton excepted), to hold to him, his
