May 10. Pardon to Thomas Tapiscote of the king's suit for the death of
Westminster. John Slolegh, whereof he is charged with Henry Crosse of Medenesford ; as the king has learned by the record of Henry Percehay and his fellows, justices appointed to deliver the gaol of the castle of Exeter, that he killed him in self-defence.

April 30. Grant to Robert de Bealknap, knight, of the keeping of the lands
Westminster. late of John de Leyhamme, who held in chief, now in the king's hand as well by the death of the said John as of John, his son and heir, who died within age and in the king's ward, to hold during the nonage of Joan, sister and heir of the last named, with her marriage, and so from heir to heir ; provided that he keep the lands without waste and do the services incumbent thereon. May 12. Pardon to John son of Simon de Cleydon of Whytewell of the king's
Westminster. suit for the death of John son of Henry de Whytewell, killed at Whytewell ; as the king has learned by the record of Thomas de Ingelby and William Burgh, justices appointed to deliver the gaol of Okeham, that he killed him in self-defence.

May 14. Presentation of Thomas Beryng, chaplain, to the vicarage of the
Westminster. church of Wolyngton, in the diocese of Bath and Wells, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the priory Golclif being in his hand on account of the war with France.

May 10. Pardon to William de Wykham, bishop of Winchester, for the
Westminster. escapes of William Smyth, parson of the church of Merewe, John de Staunton of Shakelford of the county of Surrey and Thomas Wolrigge of the county of Gloucester, clerks, from his prison of Wolveseye, in which they were detained on account of felonies of which they were convicted in the king's court, whereupon on petition made on the bishop's behalf they were delivered to him as convicted clerks ; and of whatever pertains to the king in respect of the escapes. May 20. Pardon to William Chalonere of Kegworth of the king's suit for the
Westminster. death of John Whithals of Kegworth ; as the king has learned by the record of William de Wychyngham and his fellows, late justices appointed to deliver the gaol of Leycestre, that he killed him in self-defence.

May 27. Grant to Master Thomas Spert of the prebend of Wyvelescombe in
Westminster. the cathedral church of Wells, in the king's gift by reason of the late voidance of the bishopric of Bath and Wells. By p.s.
Mandate in pursuance to J. bishop of Bath and Wells.
The like to the dean and chapter.

May 24. Presentation of John Dyn to the church of St. Michael, Longstratton,
Westminster. in the diocese of Norwich, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the alien abbey (*sic*) of Neuton Longvill being in his hand on account of the war with France.
