June 28. The like to John Wetheresfeld for the death of Stephen Fylers of Westminster. Great Grantisden; on a like record of Roger de Kirketon and John Holt, justices appointed to deliver the gaol of Huntingdon castle.

July 4. Pardon to William Asselyn of his outlawries in the county of Leicester Westminster. for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer John Burdet of Huncote touching a plea of debt of 40*l.*, and to satisfy the king of his ransom on account of a trespass against Roger de Denford, of which he was convicted; he having now surrendered to the Flete prison, and satisfied the said John of the damages adjudged to him on account of the trespass, as Robert Bealknapp, chief justice, has certified. He is, however, to satisfy the king of the said ransom.

May 22. Presentation of the king's clerk, William Dole, parson of the church Westminster. of Brotelby, in the diocese of Lincoln, to the church of Bykenor Englissh, in the diocese of Hereford, in the king's gift by reason of his wardship of the land and heir of John de Ferrers, knight, who held in chief; on an exchange of benefices with Griffin ap Johan. July 9. Writ *de intendendo* in favour of Robert Waleys of Ipswich, whom Westminster. the king's serjeant, William Strete, chief butler, has deputed to discharge the office under him in the ports of Ipswich, Colcestre and Orewell. By bill of the butler.

June 21. Commitment, during pleasure, to Thomas Kyngeton of the office Westminster. of controller of the custom of 3*d.* of the pound and other petty customs and payments due to the king in the port of Southampton, taking in the office the accustomed wages; on condition that he write his rolls with his own hand, stay there continually and discharge the office in person.
