- June 13.  
Woodstock. Pardon to Thomas de Boulton, knight, for all conspiracies and trespasses against the peace of the late king and of the king whereof he is indicted and of any consequent outlawries. By p.s.
- June 11.  
Woodstock. Ratification of a demise by David de Strabolgi, earl of Athole, to Richard Neel of Brunham, Gilbert Burgeis of Tichewell, Henry Burgeis of Tichewell and William de Waterden of the manor of Holkham, co. Norfolk (advowsons of churches and foreign knights' fees without the town of Holkham, pertaining to the manor, excepted), to hold for their lives by the rent of 1*d.* at Midsummer for five years from Michaelmas next, and then of 100*l.*, payable at All Saints and Easter. By p.s.
- The like, with respect to a demise to Edmund de Lexham, John de Gourneye, parson of the church of Harpele and William son of John de Patesle of the manor of West Lexham, co. Norfolk (advowsons of churches and foreign knights' fees without the town of West Lexham excepted), to hold for their lives by the rent of 1*d.* at Midsummer for ten years from Michaelmas next and then of 50*l.*, payable as above. By the same.
- June 16.  
Woodstock. Protection with clause *nolumus*, for one year, for the prior of Stoke Curcy.

Anian ap Yevan, king's burges of Beaumaris.
- June 28.  
Woodstock. William Pynkeney of Bydenham.  
Ralph de Ingham, parson of the church of Badyngham.
- June 15.  
Woodstock. Protection with clause *volumus*, in Ireland, until a fortnight after Michaelmas, for Alexander archbishop of Dublin, staying in England with the king on his service. By p.s.
- June 14.  
Woodstock. Exemption, for life, of Oliver de la Freyne from being put on assizes, juries or recognisances and from appointment as mayor, sheriff, coroner or other bailiff or minister of the king, against his will. By p.s.
- June 16.  
Woodstock. Grant, for life, to Amy de Gaveston, damsel of the chamber of queen Philippa, for service to the queen, of the manor of Woghfeld, co. Berks, an escheat by the forfeiture of Roger de Mortuo Mari, late earl of March. By p.s.  
Mandate in pursuance to William Trussel, the escheator.
- June 15.  
Woodstock. Pardon to William son and heir of Robert Bate for the trespass of the latter in acquiring in fee from William Bardolf the younger, in the time of Edward I., two tofts and five bovates of land in Digeby, held in chief, and for his own trespass in entering upon the same after the death of his father, without licence from Edward I., Edward II. or the present king; and licence for him to retain the same. By fine of 2 marks. Leicester.
- June 16.  
Woodstock. Grant to Robert de Tanton, king's clerk, of the prebend of Wyvelescomb, in the church of St. Andrew, Wells, in the king's gift by reason of the late voidance of the see of Bath and Wells. By p.s.  
Mandate in pursuance to R. bishop of Bath and Wells.
- April 24.  
Stamford. Grant to John de Eltham, earl of Cornwall, the king's brother, in enlargement of the late grant to him of the custody of the lands of John de Dynham to hold during minority of John, the son, or other heir, by the extent thereof made, that he shall hold the same without rendering any extent. By p.s.
- June 17.  
Woodstock. The like to Humphrey de Bohun with respect to a rent of 8*l.* payable for the manor of Ospryng, co. Kent, lately granted to him, for life, by letters patent. By p.s.
