Commission to John Inge, Henry de Guldene and John de Trevaignon to discover what lands and goods William de Muleburn, Reginald de Frome, John de Jeulton, Thomas de Spekynton, John Bisshop, John son of Peter de Draycote, Robert de Lucy, Roger Torel, Hugh de Clayhangre, Ralph de Welweton, Nicholas Gyan and John de Dommere, who have been convicted of perjury before William de Herle and his fellows, justices of the Bench, held in the county of Somerset on the day of their conviction, to take the same into the king's hands, and to cause them to be extended at their true value. The like to John de Stonore, Oliver de Carmynou, Henry Power and Richard de Trevenor, on complaint by John de Trevaignon, king's serjeant, and Joan his wife that John de Treiagu, William de Refrawel, John de Penkevel, John de Tresempel, John son of John de Cararhyn, Richard Tyrel, Ralph Devyon, Nicholas le Seys of Cruglogos, John and Ralph, his brothers, Stephen Dyn, Roger le Taillour of Bodmyn, Martin de Glostannen, William Daneles, Roger Kiggelle, Stephen Jakes, Drogo Baby, John Martyn, John Babbe, John le Mouner of Branel, Michael Catron of Nanspian, Richard Oake, William le Beek, William Cok of Nanshirgh, William Godegrome, John Noee, Henry de Trenewith, and Reginald de Cruglogos, assembling a great mob, mounted and on foot, attacked the manor of the said John at Guthfos Muer, co. Cornwall, while he was on the king's service, forced an entry, took the said Joan and delivered her into the custody of certain tithing men of those parts who imprisoned her as a thief and robber, to the great expense of the complainants and contrary to the statute of Northampton of carrying arms.
