York. Grant to Hugh de Frene, in enlargement of his late appointment to the custody of the castle and town of Cardigan and of the stewardship of Cardiganshire in South Wales, during pleasure, that he shall have the same for life. By p.s.
- Oct. 24.
York. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Hamelin de Godele, canon of the church of St. Andrew, Wells, to the dean and chapter of the said church of a messuage and two carucates of land in Wyvelescumbe, of the yearly value of 60s. as appears by inquisition taken by Henry de Gulden, escheator of the counties of Somerset, Dorset, Devon and Cornwall; in part satisfaction of the 20*l.* of land and rent which they had the late king's licence to acquire to find three chaplains to celebrate services and anniversaries for the souls of Edward I. and queen Margaret.
- Oct. 30.
York. Pardon to John le Mareschal of Scardeburgh of his outlawry in the county of York for non-appearance in the court of King's Bench to answer touching felonies and robberies in that county. By p.s.
- Oct. 6.
Nottingham. Grant to William Trussel, in enlargement of the grants to him by the late king of the custody of lands late of Peter Prylly tenant in chief, and by the present king of the marriage of Peter son of Hugh Prylly, kinsman and heir of the said Peter, of the knight's fees, advowsons of churches and all other appurtenances of the said custody. By p.s.

York. Notification of the revocation of the late appointment of John de Wyrleye to the bailiwick of Offelowe hundred, co. Stafford. By p.s.
Mandate to the said John not to intermeddle further in the bailiwick.

York. Licence, at the request of William de Clynton, for John de Mereworth to crenellate his manor of Mereworth, and a chamber within his manor of Cheriton, co. Kent. By p.s.
- Oct. 24.
York. Exemption, for life, of Andrew le Pynnere of Coventry from toll, pontage, passage, murage and pavage, as well in the realm of England as in the land of Ireland. By p.s. and fine of 1 mark. Warwick.
- Oct. 20.
York. Exemption, for life, at the request of Thomas de Evesham, king's clerk, of John de London of Pershore from being put on assizes, juries or recognisances and from appointment as sheriff, coroner or other bailiff or minister of the king against his will. By K.
- Oct. 26.
York. Ponch' de Portever of Florence, citizen of London, going beyond seas has letters nominating Andrew de Portever of Florence his attorney in England for one year.
- Oct. 25.
York. John Morice, knight, going to Ireland on the king's service has like letters nominating Thomas de Stodleye and Thomas Morice.
- Oct. 20.
York. *Inspeximus* and confirmation of letters patent of the master and brethren of the hospital of St. Leonard, York, dated 28 July 1331, being a grant, for life, at the instance of the king, to Robert Polidoit that wherever he may be staying he shall receive from their house either in person or by his attorney such meat and drink as a chaplain of the hospital receives, namely; a loaf of white bread; a gallon of ale of the better quality; flesh and fish for dinner and supper, also a loaf of the second quality and a gallon of ale of the second quality, and for his clothing 20*s.* yearly at Christmas; also that whenever the said Robert shall come to the hospital he shall have 5,000 turves yearly for his firing, sufficient litter for his bed, hay and provender (*prebendam*) for his horse daily so long as he shall stay at the house, namely, so much as one of the horses of the master or cellarer receives, and shall have a chamber there suitable to his estate, namely, the chamber
