June 26. Raby. Grant to the abbot of Haghmon who at the king's request has voluntarily given 100s. towards the charges of the marriage of his sister Eleanor to the count of Gueldre, that such grant shall not prejudice the abbey as a precedent.
The like to the abbot of Dieulacres, who has given 66s. 8d.
- June 29. Barnard Castle. Mandate to the prior and convent of the church of St. Peter, Westminster, keepers of the temporalities of Westminster abbey during voidance, for restitution thereof to Thomas de Henle, one of the monks, lately elected to be abbot of that house, which is directly subject to the church of Rome, who has been duly appointed abbot by J. archbishop of Canterbury by virtue of the apostolic authorities committed to him in that behalf and has done fealty to the king. - May 17. Burstwick. Pardon, at the request of Robert de Ufford, to John de Brewosa for entering into 30s. of rent in Waltham, co. Lincoln, held in chief, which was delivered to him when of full age by Edmund Bacoun, the keeper appointed by Edward II. to the custody of his lands during his minority, without having done homage to the king and proved his age as is customary, or having carried out any other process in the Chancery required in that behalf.
- June 30. Barnard Castle. Exemption, for life, of Thomas Purchasour from being put on assizes, juries or recognisances, and from appointment as mayor, sheriff, coroner, escheator or other bailiff or minister of the king, against his will. By K.
- June 28. Barnard Castle. Pardon to John Burgeys of Massingham of his outlawry in the county of Cambridge, for non-appearance in the court of King's Bench to answer touching a plea of trespass of John, prior of Bernewell; on certificate by Richard de Wylughby, chief justice, that he has since surrendered in the marshalsea.
- July 3. York. Protection with clause *volumus*, until All Saints, for Thomas Ughtred, going to Scotland on the king's service. By p.s.
