- March 2. Commission to Robert de Sapy, William de Bradewell and Robert York. Dapetot, reciting that a commission was lately directed to Henry de Pembrugg, Robert de Aston and Adam Lucas to make inquisition in the counties of Gloucester and Hereford touching a complaint by Henry, earl of Lancastre, that the abbot of Tintern had raised divers weirs in the river Wye, to wit, Blikeswere, Itheleswere, Asshewere, Walwere, Plumpwere, Stawere, Bathingwere and Brocwere, higher than they used to be so that ships could no longer pass to his town of Monemouthe and the adjacent parts, and that the commissioners in the exercise of their powers therein have caused the weirs of Itheleswere to be thrown down and intend to do the same with the remainder, reciting further that the abbot has since presented a petition before the king and council praying that the execution of the said commission may be stayed on the ground that all these weirs, except a moiety of Blikeswere are within the liberty of Strogull in Wales belonging to the king's uncle, Thomas, earl of Norfolk, the marshal, and are without the body of the county of Gloucester and of every other English county to make inquisition by men of the county of Gloucester, and of the said liberty and certify the king whether the weirs are in England or in Wales.
- March 2. Appointment of John Lestraunge and John de Burton to arrest and York. bring to the king James Turmmyn, Humphrey his brother, John de Cauk and Thomas Waldyn.
