Feb. 10. Prohibition to all ecclesiastical persons from proceedings in derogation  
 Roxburgh. of the king's right to collate to the prebend of Strensale, in the church of St. Peter, York, which he has recovered against William, archbishop of York, by judgement of the court of King's Bench, and of the possession of the same by John de Melbourne, king's clerk.

Feb. 9. Writ *de intendendo* for John de Enefeld, whom Richard de la Pole,  
 Bamburgh. king's serjeant, the chief butler, has appointed, during pleasure, as his deputy to execute the office of chief butler in the port of London.  
 By testimony of Richard himself.

Writ of aid for the said John as deputy of the chief butler to collect for the king's use 2s. on every tun of wine brought into the port of London by merchant strangers. By testimony of Richard himself.

Feb. 12. Pardon to Nicholas de Muro of his outlawry in the county of Gloucester,  
 Bamburgh. for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer touching a plea of Bertrand de Muro that he render an account for the time when he was his receiver; on certificate by William de Herle that he has now surrendered in the Flete prison.

Jan. 6. Grant to Thomas Gray the elder and his heirs of a moiety of carucate of  
 Roxburgh. land in Nesbit, co. Northumberland, an escheat by the forfeiture of John de Trollope, a rebel against Edward II. By p.s.  
*Vacated because on the Roll of the eighth year.*

Feb. 1. Grant to Thomas de Heton and his heirs of the lands in the town of  
 Roxburgh. Akild, co. Northumberland, which have escheated to the king by the rebellion of Adam de Prendregest, a Scot. By p.s.

Feb. 15. Pardon to Edmund Charles, who is indicted, as is said, of the theft of two  
 Newcastle-upon-Tyne. cows and some armour valued at 20s., of Edward Charles, now deceased, at Cislant, co. Norfolk, committed in the lifetime of the said Edward, of what pertains to the king in this and of any consequent outlawries; on condition that he surrender to take his trial if anyone will implead him. By p.s.

Feb. 16. Licence for the abbot and convent of Cumbermere to appropriate the  
 Newcastle-upon-Tyne. church of Ercalwe, which is said to be of their advowson. By K.

Jan. 31. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Thomas West to the prior of  
 Roxburgh. the hospital of St. John, Wylton, of two messuages, 110 acres of land, 10 acres of meadow and 6*d.* of rent, in Northbridecombe, Ugeford St. James and Swalclyve, with the advowson of the church of Northbrudecombe, to find two chaplains to celebrate divine service daily in the churches of Swalewecluf and St. John, Wilton, for the good estate of William de Monte Acuto, Katherine his wife, the said Thomas, Eleanor his wife, Thomas de Hanenebere, Olive his wife, Thomas le Dobbere, John de Molyngs and Egidia his wife, in life, for their souls after death and for the souls of their ancestors and heirs; and for the appropriation of the church by the prior. By p.s.

Grant to Peter de Berkele, king's clerk, of the provostship in the church of St. Andrew, Wells, in the king's gift by reason of the see of Bath and Wells being void and in the hands of Edward I. By K.

Mandate in pursuance to R. bishop of Bath and Wells.

Feb. 1. Licence for Ralph de Bloiou to crenellate his dwelling-places of
