- Feb. 22. Grant to Henry de Langeton, king's clerk, of the office of the pesage at
Newcastle- the king's receipt, for life. By p.s.

- Feb. 20. Pardon to Thomas son of John de Litton of his outlawry in the counties
Newcastle- of Norfolk, Suffolk and Essex for non-appearance before John de Stonore
upon-Tyne. and his fellows, justices of over and terminer, to answer touching certain
felonies whereof he was indicted; on testimony of Geoffrey le Scrope,
chief justice, that he has now surrendered in the King's Bench. By K.
- Feb. 19. Grant to Henry de Percy of all the fees in the county of Northumberland
Newcastle- which have escheated to the king by the rebellion of Patrick de Dumbar, earl of
upon-Tyne. March, to wit, the homages and services of John de Lillebourn for tenements in
the town of Benleye, of the prior of Kirkham for tenements in the town of
Tittelyngton, of Henry de Ilderton for tenements in the towns of Middelton
and Rodom, of Henry, earl of Lancaster, for tenements in the town of
Shepeleye, of William de Felton for tenements in the towns of Edelyngeham,
Lemothton and Neuton, of William de la Vale for tenements in the town
of Brampton, of the prior of Tynemuth for tenements in the towns of
Bewyk, Eggelyngeham and Westlilleburn, of the master of Harop for
tenements in the town of Harop, of John Heron for tenements in the town
of Higgeley, of Roger de Somervill for tenements in the towns of Wytton
Underwode, Horseley, Stanton and Wyndegates, of the abbot of New-
minster for tenements in Ritton, and of Thomas de Wyndegate for
tenements in the town of Wyndegate, also of 19½ marks of rent in Benley,

- Feb. 22. Grant to queen Philippa, towards the support of the heavy charges she
Newcastle- has to meet daily as well in her household as her chamber, of 350 marks
upon-Tyne. which Thomas de Lucy has to render yearly at the Exchequer for the
custody, during minority of the heir, of the lands which John de Multon of
Egremount lately held in chief in Coupeland and in the county of Cumber-
land; grant to her also of the custody of all other lands of the said John
during such minority, with knights' fees, advowsons of churches, hospitals,
chapels and religious houses and all other appurtenances. If the lands in
Coupeland and the county of Cumberland shall be resumed by the king
during minority of the heir, the queen shall have custody of these also
with the knights' fees, advowsons and other appurtenances for the rest of

- Feb. 23. Licence for Ralph de Nevill to impark his woods of Middelham and
Newcastle- Shirefhoton; and to make a deer-leap in the park of Shirefhoton notwith-
upon-Tyne. standing that this is near the king's forest of Galtres. By p.s.
- Feb. 15. Appointment of John de Bykenore, king's yeoman, to hold the bailiwick
Newcastle- of the forestership in the forest of Dene, which John White lately held,
upon-Tyne. during pleasure. By p.s.
