March 29. Pardon, with the assent of the prelates, earls, barons, and other magnates
Nottingham. attending the king in the present council assembled at Nottingham, to William de Monte Acuto, knight, for all trespasses against the peace of Edward II., and of the present king, for receiving John Mautravers the younger, lately banished from the realm, and other banished felons and enemies of the king, and for adhesion to these, whereof he is indicted, and of any consequent outlawries; also for all trespasses in breaking parks, hunting in these and in forests and chaces, and taking and carrying away deer, as well as for all trespasses of vert, and of any consequent outlawries, whether in the time of the late king or of the present king. Afterwards on 1 June, the king being at York, the same John had such letters of pardon under the words, 'With the assent of the prelates, earls, barons and magnates of the realm and others of the council in the present Parliament assembled at York.' By K.

March 30. Grant to William de Monte Acuto that, whereas John de Crumbewell
Nottingham. holds for life the custody of the Tower of London, he shall have such custody for his life, if he survive the said John. By p.s.

March 31. Grant to Nicholas de la Beche of the manor of Beaumys, co. Berks, now
Nottingham. surrendered by A. bishop of Winchester to whom the king granted it for life after it came into his hands by the forfeiture of Hugh le Despenser the elder, earl of Winchester, to hold to him and his heirs, with knights' fees and all other appurtenances as fully as the earl held it, by such services to the king and other chief lords as it was held by before it escheated. April 2. Licence for Thomas Gobyon the younger and Elizabeth his wife to
Nottingham. enfeoff Richard de Pensax of the manor of Skeggeby, held in chief. By fine of 40s.

March 10. Confirmation in mortmain of an obligation made by the prior and convent
Coventry. of St. Katherine's without Lincoln for themselves and their successors to the dean and chapter of the church of St. Mary, Lincoln, to pay yearly to them 100s. for the sustenance of a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in the said church for the souls of Masters Richard de Stretton and John de Haryngton, sometime canons of the church, and the benefactors of them and the said church. April 3. Ratification of the estate of Master Thomas Trillek, king's clerk, as
Nottingham. parson of the church of Adberbury, in the diocese of Lincoln. By K.

March 29. Pardon to John son of John Hobekynes of Mershton Jabet, a prisoner
Nottingham. in Warwick gaol, for the death of John le Warde of Bilneye at Mershton Jabet, as it appears by the record of William Trussell and his fellows, justices of oyer and terminer in the county of Warwick, that he killed him in self defence.

March 28. Ratification of the estate of William de Edyndon, king's clerk, as master
Nottingham. of the hospital of St. Cross by Winchester, notwithstanding any right the king might claim therein by reason of any voidance of the see of Winchester. By K.
