- April 17. Presentation of Hugh de Eboraco to the church of Drayton Passelewe, in the diocese of Lincoln.
- April 18. Grant to William le Engleis, king's yeoman, in enlargement of his late appointment by letters patent to the custody of the peel-house of Hegheved for life at a rent of 5 marks, that he shall hold the custody free of rent. By p.s.

- Grant to Thomas de Whitechurche, king's yeoman, in enlargement of his late appointment by letters patent to the office of porter and macebearer of the town of Kaernarvan, and by other letters patent to the bailiwick of the office of rhaglaw (*raglotie*) of Arvon and Uigheurveye, co. Carnarvon, during good behaviour, that he shall hold the office of porter and macebearer, as Richard de Wycombe, deceased, held it, and the bailiwick of the office of rhaglaw as others have hitherto held it, for his life. Prohibition to all ecclesiastical persons from proceedings in derogation of the king's right to present to the prebend of Chalk, in the church of St. Edith, Wilton, by reason of voidance of the abbey of Wilton in the time of Edward I., which he recovered by judgement of the court of King's Bench against Constance, abbess of Wilton, and of his collation of William de Raundes, king's clerk, to the same.
