- Nov. 24. Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Acceptance of a grant by letters patent under the Irish seal to Gilbert de Burgh of a messuage in the manor of Newcastle Lyouns, lately held of the king by Ralph le Forester, to hold during pleasure by the accustomed rent payable by the hands of the reeves of the manor. By K.
- Dec. 6. Auckland. Exemption from knighthood, for life, of Walter de Badeston. By p.s.
- Nov. 26. Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Protection and safe conduct, until the Annunciation, for John de Claseto, courier of R. bishop of Terouanne, envoy to the king from Philip king of France, going beyond the seas on the bishop's business. [*Fœdera.*]
- Dec. 10. Auckland. Respite from knighthood, for five years, for Thomas de Raleigh of the county of Devon. By fine of 40s. Devon.
- Dec. 8. Auckland. Grant for three years to William de Leversete and John Deveroys of the right to take customs specified in the letters patent on goods for sale brought to the towns of Ideshale and Welynton, co. Salop, and passing through those towns or along the highway between them, towards making a causey on that road. By K.
- Dec. 12. Auckland. Grant, at the request of the count of Juliers, that the men of his town of Syghen may safely come and trade within the realm under the king's protection. By K.
- Dec. 15. Auckland. Mandate to sheriffs, bailiffs and others to provide carriage at the king's charges for Francis Botiller, sent by William de Northwell, king's clerk, clerk of the Great Wardrobe, to divers parts of the realm to make purveyances. By bill of the said William.
- Dec. 12. Auckland. Grant to the bailiffs and good men of Nonneton of pontage for four years on goods passing over their bridge, to be taken by John le Barber and John le Clerk.
- Dec. 14. Auckland. Protection until Michaelmas for William de Nesham, a pilgrim (*peregrinus*) lately come from the Holy Land and now returning thither, collecting alms from the faithful.
- Dec. 25. Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Protection with clause *nolumus*, for one year, for John Menyll of Castle Levyngton.
