- July 23. Licence for the king's kinsman, Henry, earl of Lancaster, to grant in tail
Westminster. to his son, Henry, earl of Derby, and Isabella, wife of the latter, the manors
of Hanyndone, Inglesham, Langestoke, Hertleigh, Weston and Kilebourne,
said to be held in chief, and for them to re-grant these to him for life.

manor of Sampford Peverell, co. Devon. By p.s.
- July 18. Presentation of Walter de Buxston to the church of Freishewater, in the
Westminster. diocese of Winchester, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the
abbey of Lire being in his hands.
- July 23. Master Nigel de Wauere and John de Claxton, canons of the cathedral
Westminster. church of Chichester, bringing news of the death of John, their bishop, have
letters for the dean and chapter of licence to elect. By p.s.
- July 23. Licence for the alienation in frank almain by the king's kinsman, Thomas
Westminster. Wake of Lydell, to the prior and convent of Haltemprice, of a messuage
and 6 acres of land in Lydell, 40*l.* of rent out of the manor of Lydell and
lands in Arturet, Stubhill and Levyngton, co. Cumberland, said to be held
in chief. By p.s.
- July 25. Mandate to William Trussel, escheator on this side Trent, for restitution
Tower of London. of the temporalities of the see of Worcester, void by the translation of S. late
bishop of that place, to Ely, to Thomas de Hemenhale, a monk of the church
of Norwich, who has been appointed bishop by provision of Pope Benedict,
and has done fealty to the king after publicly renouncing all words in the
Pope's bull prejudicial to him and the crown. By p.s.

- July 23. Grant to Robert de Mauley, king's yeoman, that all the lauds, and the
Westminster. forestry and ward of Hopedale, which Margery, late the wife of Robert de
Haustede, holds for life in Blakebrok, Fairefeld, Hope, Boudon and
Chapele 'in the Frith,' co. Derby, by grant of queen Philippa as of the
manor of High Peak, shall remain to him and to his heirs, with the
knight's fees, advowsons of churches, liberties and all other appurtenances.

- July 26. Licence for William de Whitewell to enfeoff Nicholas de Hedersete,
Westminster. Richard de Burwode and John Yemme, of the manor of Wynterburne
Kynkeston, said to be held in chief, and for them to re-grant it to him and
Katherine, his wife, in tail, with remainder to William Brikke of Wichinham,
in fee. By p.s.
- July 25. *Inspecimus* and confirmation of letters patent, dated 15 July, 4 Edward II.,
Westminster. being an *inspecimus* and confirmation of a charter, dated at Berkhamsted,
Tuesday in Easter Week, 12 Edward I., by Edmund, sometime earl of Corn-
wall, releasing to the Friars Preachers of Chichester the rent of the place
where they dwell and granting them licence to acquire more land and to erect
buildings thereon; and a licence for them, as they had not yet acquired
such land, to acquire five places on which to construct a church and other

- July 25. The like of a grant, dated at Trym, 1 May, 11 Edward II., by Roger de
Westminster. Mortuo Mari, late lord of Wygemore and Trym, to Valentine de Mortuo Mari
and Henry, his brother, of the lands in Wardeton, which escheated from
Walter de Lacy, knight, when he joined the Scots in rebellion against the
king, and came to the said Roger by virtue of a grant by letters patent of
Edward II. made to him under the great seal of England of all forfeited
lands of the said Walter within the liberty of Trym, to hold to them and
the heirs of their bodies by the service of a rose at Midsummer.
