- Oct. 5. Richard de Denton going beyond the seas in the company of William de Bohun, earl of Northampton, has letters nominating William de Wyclif and John de Haveryngton of Caldecotes his attorneys in England until Easter. By testimony of the earl. J. de Sancto P. received the attorneys.
- Oct. 6. John de Nevill of Essex, going in the company, &c. as above, has like letters nominating Robert de Teye, his attorney. Th. de Evesh[am] received the attorneys.
- Oct. 6. Giles de Bassyngburn, going beyond the seas with Henry, bishop of Lincoln, has letters nominating Robert de Ellerton and Hugh de Berewyco his attorneys in England until the said feast. Th. de Evesh[am] received the attorneys.
- Oct. 2. Licence for the abbot and convent of Buklond to crenellate the dwelling-place and church of their abbey in the county of Devon. By p.s.

- Sept. 26. Grant to John de Bradeston, king's yeoman, that in lieu of the 20 marks yearly at the Exchequer lately granted to him by letters patent for service to Edward, duke of Cornwall and earl of Chester, he shall have 20 marks of the farm of the hundred of Wormelowe in Irchenfeld for life or until the king grant him an equivalent in land or rent. By p.s.
- Oct. 3. Pardon, at the request of Richard, earl of Arundel, to Richard Alfriche of Gleddon for stealing a primer and two rings (*primarium et unum par des anees*), and of any consequent outlawry; on condition that he stand his trial if any one implead him and go beyond the seas on the king's service to stay for such time as the king shall stay there. By p.s. [10,314.]
- Oct. 1. Grant to the bailiffs and good men of the city of Norwich of murage for five years. By K.
Grant in like terms to the mayor, bailiffs and good men of Lincoln, for four years. By K.
- Oct. 6. Pardon, in consideration of his service in Scotland and elsewhere, to Ralph de Stafford of 260*l.* due by him and his ancestors and now required of him by summons of the Exchequer. By K.
- Sept. 28. Writ *de intendendo* to the mayor, bailiffs and good men of Walyngford in favour of Edward, duke of Cornwall and earl of Chester, with respect to the yearly farm of their town, which the king has granted to him on his late creation as duke, and his heirs, first born sons of the kings of England and dukes of Cornwall. By K. & the whole C. in Parliament.
The like to John de Meree with respect to the farm of 80*l.* which he has to pay for the castle and manor of Meree, co. Wilts.
The like to the mayor, bailiffs and good men of Exeter with respect to the yearly farm of 20*l.* of their city.
- Sept. 28. Protection and safe conduct for Michael Leure, merchant of San Sebastian in Spain, who has brought a cargo of merchandise to Southampton in his ship, called *la Seinte Katerine* of San Sebastian in Spain, while trading with the goods and returning to his own country, and for his men and mariners. By C.
- Oct. 6. Grant, in consideration of good service to Edward II., and because he is now too weak to work, to Roger de Braybury of 3*l.* daily to be paid by the constable of Wyndesore castle out of the issues of his bailiwick, until the king order otherwise for his estate. By p.s.
- Oct. 6. Protection with clause *volumus*, until Easter, for Gawan Corder, going beyond the seas on the king's service. By testimony of the king's steward.
