- March 25. Westminster. Whereas the king by charter granted in tail male to William de Clynton, earl of Huntingdon, at the time of his creation as earl, the manor of Kirketon, with the soke, members, hamlets and other appurtenances, co. Lincoln, which fell into the king's hands by the death of John, earl of Cornwall, his brother, to hold with knights' fees, advowsons of churches, reversions and all other things belonging to them, and the earl has made petition to him shewing that he is impeached over the receiving of 100s. due from John de Westmonasterio, Emma his wife, and Thomas their son, to the said earl of Cornwall as from an escheat in his hands, from a tenement sometime of Thomas de Bromholm, which they had by grant for their lives by the earl, afterwards confirmed by letters patent of the king, on the ground that it is not expressly mentioned in the charter; the said earl of Huntingdon is to have the said 100s. yearly with the reversion of the lands charged with the same after the death of the said John, Emma and Thomas, it having been and still being the king's intention that he should receive that as well as all other reversions pertaining to the manor. - Aug. 13. Tower of London. Licence for the master and brethren of the house of St. Mark, Billeswyk, by Bristol, to require in mortmain land and rent, not held in chief, to the yearly value of 5 marks. By p.s.
- Dec. 16. Westminster. Licence for the alienation in mortmain to the prior and convent of Launde, in satisfaction of 8 marks of the 20 marks yearly of land and rent which they have licence to acquire, of the following; by Robert de Dodyngton, a messuage and a bovate of land in Tilton, with a release of 7 marks of rent which they render for certain lands in Skeftington, and by John Robyn of Asfordeby and Alice Burheved, the reversion of a messuage and a bovate of land in Friseby held for life by Matilda Bakester. The said messuages and lands are of the yearly value of 9s., as appears by the inquisition.
