May 1. Pardon to Hugh Kynessone and Sarah his wife for acquiring for their
Westminster. lives and one year after from Roger de Huntyngheld a messuage and 20 acres
of land in Bokesworth, held in chief, and entering therein without licence;
and licence for them to retain the same. By fine of 10s. Cambridge.

April 29. Whereas on 27 July last the king appointed the prior of Cogges to the
Westminster. custody of the priory, which had been lately taken into his hands with other
alien priories, to hold during pleasure by the rent of 10*l.*, in compassion for
the poverty of the prior and his house, as well as for the glory of God and
St. George the Martyr in whose honor the church of the priory was founded
by his progenitors and at the request of queen Philippa, he has granted
that the prior shall hold the custody quit of the said rent and pardoned the
arrears of the farm to this date. By p.s.

April 28. Mandate to the chancellor or keeper or keepers of the Great Seal for the
Westminster. time being to present Robert Cionis de Cercaldo, king's clerk, to the first
void church of the value of 40*l.* or upward, or prebend of the value of from
20*l.* to 40*l.* in the king's gift, in the diocese of London or elsewhere,
which he will accept. By p.s.

April 30. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by John de Faucomberge of
Westminster. Skelton of six messuages, seven bovates of land and 36s. of rent, in
Normanby, Acclom, Neuby and Skelton in Clyveland, to a chaplain to
celebrate divine service daily in Skelton chapel for the souls of the said
John and his ancestors, notwithstanding that it appears by the inquisition
that four messuages and five bovates of land in Skelton are held of the king
as of the crown by the service of a nineteenth part of a knight's fee, and
that if the said John die leaving his heir under age the king will lose the
custody of these, and that he lose also in case of any escheat. By p.s.

April 26. Grant to the mayor, sheriffs and all other citizens of London of murage
Westminster. for five years. By K. & C.

April 28. Grant for life to John de Sapy of such wages and robes in the household
Westminster. as other of the king's knights receive from him. By p.s.

May 4. Presentation of John de Waterton to the vicarage of the church of
Westminster. Byrlyngg in the diocese of Rochester, in the king's gift by reason of the
temporalities of the priory of Bermundeseye being in his hands on account
of the war between him and those of France.

April 28. Pardon to the prior and convent of Cattle of their contingent of the last
Westminster. three-yearly tenth granted to the king by the clergy, to wit, 11*l.*s. 3*¼**d.*

April 28. Grant that Stephen Reynald, master of a ship called *The ship of*
Westminster. *St. Michael* of Bristol, who lately went to Gascony to aid another ship of
Bristol, called *la Seintemariécogge*, whereof Roger de Langeleye was
master, which took Hugh Starky, a messenger of Oliver de Ingham,
seneschal of that duchy, lately sent by the king to the said Oliver on
important business, as appears by letters of the latter, the mariners and
