- June 2. Pardon to John Toly for the death of William le Cok, as it appears by
Bury the record of John de Shardelowe and his fellows, justices appointed to
St. Edmunds. deliver the gaol of Cambridge castle, that he killed him in self defence.
- June 3. Protection, during pleasure, for John Bysset of Rachryn, Ireland, out
Bury of regard for John de Insulis, whose kinsman he is, and his men, lands, and
St. Edmunds. goods in Ireland. By K.
- March 29. Mandate to the chancellor and the keepers of the Great Seal for the time
Newcastle- being to present Thomas de Badby, king's clerk, clerk of the pantry and
upon-Tyne. buttry, to the first void church in the king's gift of the value of not
more than 39 marks or less than 20 marks a year, which he will accept.

- June 2. Grant to the bailiffs and good men of Harwich, who intend to enclose the
Bury town with a wall of stone and to crenellate the wall, of murage for five years
St. Edmunds. on things for sale coming by land or water to their town, or to the port of
Erewell pertaining to the town. By K. & C.
- June 3. Ratification of the estate of William de Frollesbury as parson of the
Bury church of Halesworth on the presentation of John de Argentein. By p.s.
St. Edmunds.
- June 7. Pardon, in consideration of his fruitful services to the king and realm,
Lopham. his heavy charges and anxieties therein, and the high place which he has
long held in the direction of public affairs, to John, archbishop of Canter-
bury, of all debts and accounts due by him as well of times when he has
gone beyond the seas or elsewhere in the service of the late or present
king, and of prest money received by him for expenses or wages, as of
other times and other moneys received by him in any other way; also of
any actions the king could have against him in respect of these. By p.s.
- June 6. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Master John de Horwode
Bury and Giles Lengleys, clerk, to Roger Outlawe, prior of the Hospital of
St. Edmunds. St. John of Jerusalem in Ireland, and the brethren of the Hospital, in satis-
faction of 24*l.* of the 40*l.* yearly of land and rent for the support of a convent
of brethren at Kilmaynan which they have the king's licence to acquire,
of the manor of Lestornan, in Ireland, which is of the yearly value of 18*l.*,
as those in whom the king has confidence have testified before him. By K.
- June 9. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by John, bishop of Exeter, to
Lopham. the dean and chapter of Exeter, of the advowson of the church of
St. Marina, co. Cornwall, and for the appropriation of the church by the
dean and chapter for an anniversary for the bishop after his death and other
works of piety. By p.s.
- Licence for John, bishop of Exeter, to appropriate the church of
Teyngton, co. Devon, of his advowson. By p.s.
- June 8. Mandate to sheriffs, bailiffs, ministers and others to provide carriages
Lopham. for John de Wyght, bringing things for the king from London to Ipswich,
to last until St. Peter ad Vincula. By K.
- June 9. Pardon to the men of Portsmouth, in consideration of their town having
Lopham. been burned by the enemy, of the remainder of the three-yearly tenth due
from them. By p.s.
- Mandate in pursuance to the collectors of the tenth and fifteenth.
