Licence for William Heyron to crenellate the dwelling-place of his manor of Ford, co. Northumberland. By K.

Pardon to Thomas son of Thomas Dodesone of Heselwode of his outlawry in the county of Cumberland for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer touching a plea of William de Hillum, late parson of the church of Wygeton, that he render an account of the time in which he was his receiver; he having now surrendered to the Flete prison as appears by the certificate of John de Stonore, chief justice.

Exemption for life of Richard de Cretyng from being put on assizes, juries or recognisances, and from appointment as mayor, sheriff, coroner, escheator or other bailiff or minister of the king, against his will. By p.s.

Grant, in consideration of his charges in the king's service in Scotland and elsewhere, to Thomas de Verdon that he shall have the custody of the manor of Assheby David, co. Northampton, which manor he and Alice his wife hold for the life of the latter of the inheritance of John, son and heir of Edmund Peverel, a minor, and which is held of Laurence de Hastynges, the king's ward, until the full age of the said John, if the said Alice die during the minority of Laurence, rendering after her death the extent of the same at the Exchequer. *Inspeximus* and confirmation of a surrender by queen Isabella to William de Monte Acuto, earl of Salisbury, of the castle and manor of Hawardyn, the manors of Lee, Boselee, and Neston, co. Chester, and the castle and town of Mold, as well as of the stewardship of Chester with all things pertaining thereto in the counties of Chester and Flynt and in Wales, knight's fees, advowsons of churches, wards, marriages and reliefs excepted, sometime of Robert de Monte Alto, steward of Chester, then held by her and granted to the earl in reversion by the king, with forests, chaces, parks, woods, mills, fisheries, stanks, waters, warrens, fairs, markets, liberties, wreck of sea and other appurtenances, in exchange for 600 marks yearly granted to her by the earl out of the 1,000 marks granted to him by the king out of the coinage of tin in the county of Cornwall.
