life by the king, to keep the fees and other profits pertaining to her in right thereof, to receive all debts due to the king or the queen, to make due acquittances therein, and executions of the king's writs and mandates, and to do all other duties of the office.

May 20. Exemplification of letters patent, dated 10 July 8 Edward III. which  
Berkhampstead. have been accidentally lost, granting for life to Robert Bosevill the bailiwick of the wapentake of Strafford, co. York, at the rent of 10*l*.

May 15. Notification that by a certificate by the treasurer and barons of the Ex-  
Berkhampstead. chequer it is shewn that the church of Twenge is divided, and that in the taxation of Pope Nicholas IV. in 1291, the part of Roger in the church is taxed at 20*l*. and the part of John therein at 20*l*.; that on 22 September, 1 Edward III. the king, by writ, commanded William, archbishop of York, to cause a survey to be made of benefices in his diocese which had been so wasted by the Scots that they were not sufficient to bear a tenth levied after the said taxation, and that in the certificate therein made by the prior of the monastery of Warter, the prior of the house of Feriby, Masters Thomas de Nova Villa and Robert de Duston, surveyors of such benefices in the archdeaconry of the East Riding, it is contained thus; the church of Twenge is divided between two rectors; the part of one is taxed at 18 marks, the part of the other is taxed at 18 marks.

May 10. Grant to Robert de Dalderby of Lincoln, in satisfaction of 180*l*. paid  
Berkhampstead. by him for wool bought for the king's use in Durdraught of Roger de Glentworth of Fylyngham, and 100 marks delivered in the wardrobe in the custody of William de Northwell, king's clerk, keeper thereof, as a loan for the expenses of the household, and out of gratitude, of 60*l*. yearly, at the usual terms, out of the farm of the city of Lincoln for six years, the first payment to be made at Michaelmas. May 24. Exemplification under the seal now in use of letters patent 10 July,  
Berkhampstead. 11 Edward III. granting to John de Thamworth, king's clerk, the deanery of Redenhale.

May 25. Licence for the chancellor, masters and scholars of the university of  
Berkhampstead. Oxford to build a stone cross in the parish of St. Mary Magdalen's, opposite the north gate of the town. By the Keeper & C.

May 25. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Master John de Faryndon and  
Berkhampstead. William de Brinton, chaplains, to the abbot and convent of Glastonbury, in satisfaction of 16*s*. of the 20*l*. yearly of land and rent which they have the king's licence to acquire, of the reversion of a messuage, a carucate of land, 12 acres of meadow, 30 acres of pasture and 10 acres of alder wood, in Uplym, held for life by Michael de Lynche and Alice his wife, which are held of the abbot and convent and are of the yearly value of 13*s*. 4*d*. as appears by inquisition taken by Ralph de Middelneye, escheator in the counties of Somerset, Dorset, Devon and Cornwall.

May 28. Exemplification under the seal now in use of letters patent, dated  
Berkhampstead. 30 October, 3 Edward III. granting licence for the alienation in mortmain by Thomas Belecher and Christina his wife of three messuages in Bristol to a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in the church of St. Stephen, Bristol.
