- Feb. 1. Westminster. Commission to Richard Hillary, Simon de Ruggeley and William de Perton, to survey the estate of the king's free chapel of Wolvernehampton, and the manse, houses and other things pertaining to the same, which are reported to have been greatly wasted in the time of Master Hugh Elys, the last dean; issued because the chapel is free from all ordinary jurisdiction and none but the king can meddle with it. The commissioners are also to make inquisition by oath of good men of the county of Stafford in the presence of Philip de Weston, king's clerk, to whom the king has now granted the deanery, and of the executors of the will of the said Hugh, or of those in whose hands his goods now are, and certify the king fully herein. - Feb. 14. Kennington. Commission of oyer and terminer to William Scot, William Basset, Thomas de Fencotes and John de Ellerker the elder, on complaint by Richard, bishop of Durham, that whereas he had been sent by the king with others beyond the seas to treat with certain cardinals of matters concerning the king and the estate of the realm, and he and his men and lands were in the king's special protection, some persons broke his park at Creyk and entered his free warren at Osmunderleye and Cotteclif, co. York, hunted there, cut down trees, carried away trees, deer, hares, rabbits and partridges, and assaulted his men and servants. By the Keeper and the whole C.
- Feb. 14. Kennington. Association of Peter de Bradefeld with William de Tweng, Robert de Scardeburgh, John de Ellerker and Thomas de Burton, lately appointed in the East Riding of the county of York as commissioners of array and of the peace, and justices of oyer and terminer. By C.
- Feb. 8. Kennington. Commission of oyer and terminer to John Lestraunge, William de Sharesull, Roger Hillary, Hamo Lestraunge and Richard de Peshale, on complaint by William de Sheldon that Richard son of Walter Banastre, William, Roger and Adam, his brothers, Richard son of Richard Banastre of Smethecote, William son of Roger Banastre, Roger son of Roger Gesenok of Wolascote, John his brother, Richard son of Walter de Preston and others assaulted him at Shrewsbury, took away his horse and 250 sheep, worth 30*l.* carried away his goods with 16 marks in money, charters, writings and other muniments, and assaulted his men and servants. - Jan. 27. Kennington. Appointment, pursuant to the ordinance of the late Parliament at Westminster for the arrest of suspected persons, of Thomas de Gurneye of Harpetre, knight, to take William le Taillour of Chester, Hugh de Langedenedale of the county of Lancaster and Henry Bulluck of Chyweton Undermenedep, suspected of the death of Richard atte Halle and other felonies, and imprison them in Somerton gaol in the custody of the sheriff of Somerset.
