Mandate in pursuance to the abbot of St. James's without Northampton, William Lovel, Thomas de Bukton, Eustace de Brunneby, John de Hegham and John de Walgrave, collectors of the said subsidy in the county of Northampton.

June 8. Shotley. Ratification of the estate of Richard de Twyverton, king's clerk, as parson of the church of Adesham in the diocese of Canterbury, on the collation of J. archbishop of Canterbury. By p.s.

June 15. Ipswich. Presentation of John de Malteby to the vicarage of the church of Blythe in the diocese of York, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the priory of Blythe being in his hands on account of the war with France.

June 11. Shotley. Grant, in consideration of his service to Edward II. and the present king and because he is too infirm to pass beyond the seas in the king's company, to Master Walter de Wygemore, king's serjeant, of $7\frac{1}{2}d.$ a day and two robes a year, or the value thereof, as the other king's serjeants have, until the king's return. By p.s.

June 9. Shotley. Licence for William de Kerdeston to crenellate his dwelling-place of Claxton, co. Norfolk. By p.s.

June 8. Ipswich. Notification to all persons interested that, whereas the king by letters patent lately granted in fee to Thomas de Bradestan the reversion of the castle and manor of Thalimeir and land and lordship of Buelte, in South Wales, after the death of Alesia, countess of Lincoln, who holds the same for life by the name of the castle and land of Buelte, and commanded the countess to attorn to him accordingly, it was not the king's intention to prejudice the countess in her estate in the castle and land thereby. June 12. Ipswich. John Giffard, canon of the church of Wells and prebendary of St. Decumans in that church, and canon of the church of Salisbury and prebendary of Yatemynstre Netherbury in that church, going to the court of Rome, has letters nominating Alan de Esshe and John de Holt as his attorneys in England until Ascension Day.

Th[omas] de Brayt[on] received the attorneys.

The like for him as warden and master of the hospital of St. Leonard, York.

The like for the same John Giffard of Cotherstok.

The like for the same John Giffard, canon of the church of St. Peter, York, and prebendary of Grendale, in that church, with a moiety of the church of Axemynstre annexed to the prebend.

June 12. Ipswich. Mandate to John de Dryby and Anne his wife to attorn in the usual manner to John Brocas for the services due from lands in Wokefeld, which they hold for the life of Anne of the king's grant, the king having granted the reversion of those lands to him in fee.

June 12. Ipswich. The like to Jacomina, late the wife of Robert le Meerck, with respect to lands in Donemowe, co. Essex, held by her for life, the reversion whereof has been granted to the said John in like manner as an escheat by the forfeiture of Ingelram le Meerck, son and heir of Robert and Jacomina, an adherent of Philip de Valesio.

June 8. Ipswich. Presentation of Richard le Spenser, parson of the chapel of Eton Costantyn in the diocese of Coventry and Lichfield, to the vicarage of the church of Alberbury in the diocese of Hereford, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of the priory of Alberbury being in his hands on
