- Feb. 4. Pardon to Richard de Burghull of Gloucester of his outlawry in the
Westminster. county of Gloucester for non-appearance before the justices of the Bench to answer touching a plea of Andrew de Penedok of Gloucester that he render an account for the time when he was his receiver; on certificate by John de Stonore, chief justice, that he has now surrendered to the Flete prison.
- Feb. 6. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Thomas de Berkele of a
Westminster. messuage, 40 acres of land and 20s. of rent, in Portbury, Eston and Bedemenstre, to a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily in the chapel of St. Katharine, Katerine Pull, by Bristol, as he shall ordain. By p.s.
- Feb. 6. Grant for life to Simon de Barlynges, chaplain, of the wardenship of the
Westminster. hospital of the Holy Innocents without Lincoln, void by the resignation of John de Codyngton, king's clerk. By p.s.
Writ *de intendendo* to the brethren and sisters of the hospital.
Mandate to the sheriff of Lincoln to induct him.
- Feb. 12. Presentation of William de Shrovisbury to the church of Stibenheth, in
Westminster. the diocese of London, in the king's gift by reason of the late voidance of the see. By p.s.
- Feb. 10. Presentation of William Torald of Warrewyk to the church of Rommes-
Westminster. dene Creye, in the same diocese, void by the resignation of John de Warrewyk.
- Feb. 13. Whereas the king by letters patent lately appointed John de Helmeswell,
Westminster. 'malman,' to the custody of the meadows, mills and rabbit-warren, pertaining to his castle of Notingham, for life, with such wages as John de Baston, deceased, had; inasmuch as he cannot dispense with the personal service of the said John, he has granted that he may depute some one to supply his place in the custody. - Feb. 13. Licence for Roger Hillary to crenellate his dwelling-place of Berk-
Westminster. mondescote, co. Stafford. By p.s.
- Feb. 20. Presentation of Robert de Warthecopp, king's clerk, parson of the
Westminster. church of Dystyngton, in the archdeaconry of Richmond, to the church of Kirkebythore, in the diocese of Carlisle, in the king's gift by reason of his custody of the lands and heir of Robert de Clifford, tenant in chief; on an exchange of benefices with Roger de Clyfford.
- March 3. Whereas Matilda late the wife of Thomas le Fisher and the said
Westminster. Thomas in his life time acquired in fee from Walter de Deneford, son and heir of John de Deneford, a messuage and 58 acres of land in Farnedissh, held in chief of Edward II, and the said Walter after the death of John, and Matilda and Thomas subsequently, entered upon the same without the licence of the said king or the present king; the latter has pardoned the trespasses in this behalf and restored to the said Matilda the messuage and land which had been taken into his hands on account thereof.
By fine of 1 mark because the tenements are worth nothing beyond the services and are held of the king by petty serjeanty.
- March 2. *Inspecimus* and confirmation of letters of John, prior of Durham, and
Westminster. the convent of that place, dated in their chapter, on 22 December, 1344, inspecting and confirming letters patent of Richard, bishop of Durham, dated at Houeden, on 1 May, 1344, appointing his servant, Richard de Mertok, to have the custody of his manor in London, for life, with wages
