June 26. Ratification of the estate of Master John de Offord, king's clerk, dean
Porchester. of the church of St. Mary, Lincoln, as prebendary of Masham, in the
church of St. Peter, York, on the collation of the king made in the late
voidance of the archbishopric of York. By K.
- June 24. Pardon, at the request of Richard, earl of Arundel, to Richard de
Porchester. Eyton, vicar of the church of Baschirche, of the king's suit for the death
of William de Achesleye, whereof he is appealed, and of any consequent
outlawry. By p.s.
- June 27. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Thomas de Bello Campo,
Porchester. earl of Warwick, to the dean and canons of the collegiate church of
Asteleye of the advowson of the church of Lange Staunton, co. Cambridge,
said to be held in chief; and for the appropriation of the church by the
dean and canons. By p.s.
- June 26. Grant to John de Molyns that, from the present passage of the king
Portsmouth. beyond the seas until his return to England, he shall not be put in any
office or sent by the king or council about the king's business, or to do
any other thing in the king's name, against his will. By p.s.
- June 28. Grant that, inasmuch as Master Andrew le Fevre (*Faber*), the king's
Porchester. smith in the Tower of London, by his order is going with him beyond the
seas, Katharine late the wife of Master Walter le Fevre, mother of the
said Andrew, during his absence in the king's service, shall keep up the
king's forge within the Tower and carry on the work of the forge, receiving
the wages pertaining to the office, to wit 8*d.* a day. By p.s.
Mandate to the treasurer and chamberlains to pay her the wages.

- June 20. Release, at the request of William de Clynton, earl of Huntingdon, to
Porchester. the prior of Haylyngg, in Haylyngg Island, of 20*l.* out of the 120*l.* yearly
which he has to pay yearly for his priory, now in the king's hands among
the other alien priories, for such time as the priory remains in his hands,
because it has been testified before the king that 260 acres of arable land,
wood, pasture and heath belonging to the priory in the said island have
been swallowed up by the sea in his time and the island is every day laid
waste by the sea, whereby the prior has entirely lost a large amount of
rent and profit supporting alms, works of piety and charges falling on the
priory. By K.
- June 21. Whereas the king by letters patent lately pardoned Geoffrey del Holt on
Porchester. condition that he should go on his service for one year at his own charges,
at the suit of Richard, earl of Arundel, shewing that the said Geoffrey
stays continually in his service and cannot be absent therefrom without
loss to the earl, he grants that Geoffrey shall not be compelled to keep
the condition aforesaid. By p.s.

- June 26. Licence for Edward, prince of Wales, to make his will to provide for
Porchester. payment of great debts contracted on account of his going forth with the
king to parts beyond the sea, in case he die charged with such debts.
