Jan. 23. Ratification of the estate of Baldwin de Whitteneye, king's clerk, as Westminster. dean of the church of St. Edith, Tamworth, notwithstanding any right the king might have in this behalf. By p.s.

Jan. 24. Whereas Thomas de Hemegrave, 'chivaler,' lately appointed with others Westminster. in the county of Suffolk to collect the wool last granted to the king there, by reason of his great age and bodily weakness has not intermeddled in any way with the collection of the same, as has been testified to the king by Henry earl of Lancaster and Robert earl of Suffolk; the king has pardoned him his trespass in this. Jan. 1. Licence, at the request of John Darcy, for the alienation in mortmain Westminster. by Master Simon de Islep, Nicholas de Bukeland and John de Sautre to the prioress and nuns of Hevenynges of an acre of land in Wilmersleye and the advowson of the church of Wilmersleye, held of Queen Philippa as of the honour of Pontefract: and for the appropriation of the church by the prioress and nuns. Dec. 22. Licence for Humphrey de Bohun, earl of Hereford, to crenellate the Guildford. dwelling-places of his manors of Writele, Brymshoo, Apechilde, Depeden and Waleden, co. Essex, Enefeld, co. Middlesex, Wockeseye, Uphavene and Sende, co. Wilts, and Whitenhurst, co. Gloucester. By p.s.

Jan. 20. Grant to John Broun, king's yeoman, in enlargement of the late grant Westminster. to him for life of the toft, water-mill and lands in Shipton, co. Oxford, which escheated to the king by the forfeiture of Hugh le Despenser, the younger, that he shall hold the same in fee. By p.s.

Jan. 15. Writ of aid, for one year, for Thomas de Totebury, charged by the Westminster. steward of the household of Queen Philippa to buy those things required in the office of the great wardrobe of that household, pursuant to the statute. Renewed because sealed at another time by bill of the steward of the queen.

Jan. 22. Presentation of James de Hothum to the prebend of Wertlyng, Westminster. Neuenfeld and Hoo, in the king's free chapel of Hastynges, in the diocese of Chichester, void by the resignation of Master John de Heslarton. By p.s.

Jan. 20. Licence for the alienation in mortmain by Master Gilbert de Bukyngham Westminster. of land and rent not held in chief, to the value of 10 marks yearly, to a chaplain to celebrate divine service according to an ordinance to be made by him for the good estate of the king, his heirs and the said Gilbert, and for the souls of the king and Gilbert when they are dead. Jan. 22. Exemplification of letters patent under the seal lately used by the king Westminster. in foreign parts, dated by Calais, 28 June, 21 Edward III, pardoning Adam de Blencowe for acquiring in fee from William de Craystok twenty-two messuages, a mill, four carucates and 60 acres of land, 10 acres of meadow and 15s. of rent in Neubiggyng and Blencowe, and from Gilbert de Suthayk two messuages, 24 acres of land and 10 acres of meadow in Skelton, held in chief, and entering thereon without licence.
