July 14. Licence, for 60s. which Richard Bulky, Peter de Handesacre and Adam Vestminster. le Carpenter will pay to the king, for the alienation in mortmain by them of three messuages, a toft, two virgates of land and 6 acres of meadow, in Stodeleye, to a chaplain to celebrate divine service daily at the altar of St. Mary in the parish church of Stodeley, as they shall ordain, for the good estate of Henry de Middelmores, for his soul when he is dead, and for the souls of John de Middelmores and Lettice, his wife, the father and mother of the said Henry, and all their ancestors.

And the 60s. have been paid in the hanaper. Warwick.

July 9. Grant for life to John Shepcote of the office of keeping the king's stud Clarendon. within the park of Wyndesore, he taking in the office the usual wages and fees. By p.s.

July 14. Presentation of Gilbert Coleman, chaplain, to the vicarage of the Clarendon. church of Aston Abbots, of the ordinary jurisdiction of the abbey of St. Albans, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of that abbey.

July 11. Grant to Stephen de Cusyngton, in part satisfaction of a great sum Vestminster. due to him of the time when he was in the king's service in the company of the king's daughter Joan, now deceased, in Gascony, of all the winter crops growing in the lands of the archbishopric of Canterbury, now void by the death of John de Stratford, at the price agreed upon between W. bishop of Winchester, the treasurer, and him, to wit each acre sown with wheat for 6s. and each acre, sown with mesline, rye, winter barley and 'spryg,' for 4s. By p.s.

Mandate to Master John Cook and his fellows, guardians of the void archbishopric, to deliver the crops to him by indenture at the above prices.

July 10. Ratification of the estate of Master Robert de Askeby, king's clerk, as Clarendon. prebendary of the prebend of Wrytlyngton with Forthyngton, in the church of St. Mary, Salisbury. By p.s.

July 12. Grant to the king's daughter Isabel of the keeping of the lands which Clarendon. Isabel late the wife of John Lovel, tenant in chief, held on the day of her death of the inheritance of the heir of the said John, to hold until the heir come of age. By p.s.

July 14. Presentation of Thomas de Cottingham to the church of Askeby, in the Clarendon. diocese of Norwich, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the abbey of St. Benet, Hulme.

July 8. Ratification of the estate of John le Baker of Wytteneye as parson of Clarendon. the church of Sparkford, on the presentation of Isabel late the wife of John Lovel. By p.s.

June 10. Presentation of John Edward to the church of Risebergh, of the Woodstock. immediate jurisdiction of Canterbury, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the archbishopric of Canterbury. By p.s.

Presentation of John son of Hugh to the church of Offord Cluny, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities in England of the abbey of Cluny being in his hands on account of the war with France. By p.s.

July 20. Admission of brother Peter de Falco, fellow-monk of the abbot of Bec Clarendon. Hellouin, who dwells in parts beyond the seas, and general proctor of the said abbot and the convent of that place, as attorney in England in all pleas affecting the abbot and the house of Bec, for five years.
