Oct. 8. Licence for Henry, earl of Lancaster, and Isabel, his wife, to grant  
Westminster. for life to Hugh de Camoys, 'chivaler,' the manor of Langestok, co.  
Southampton, said to be held in chief. By K.

Oct. 6. Master Edmund Morteyn, going on pilgrimage to the city of Rome,  
Westminster. has letters nominating William de Rothewell and John de Tamworth,  
clerks, as his attorneys in England until Easter.

Oct. 8. Protection with clause *volumus*, until Michaelmas next, for Philip de  
Westminster. Bardes, Walter, his son, Alexander de Bardes, Bartholomew son of Ralph  
de Bardes, Peter, his brother, Bartholomew son of John de Bardes,  
Gerard de Bonenseigne, Peter Byne, Nicholas Marini and their fellows,  
merchants of the society of the Bardi, who are bound to the king in a  
great sum of money to be paid at a certain date; that debts be not  
recovered from them by their creditors in the meantime. By K.

Oct. 11. The like for Robert Thomasy de Peruche, Peter Simonis, Angelus  
Westminster. Soderini and their fellows, merchants of the society of the Peruzzi.

Oct. 4. Presentation of John son of Walter, chaplain, to the vicarage of the  
Westminster. church of Haghham, in the diocese of Lincoln, in the king's gift by  
reason of the priory of Haghham being in his hands on account of the  
war with France.

Oct. 1. Licence for the prior and convent of the church of St. Mary,  
Westminster. Worcester, to appropriate the church of Croppethorn, which is of their  
advowson, and is held in chief, as is said. By K.

Oct. 6. Pardon to John son of Henry de Langeton of Wotton of the king's  
Westminster. suit for the death of Simon Raton of Wotton, killed before 5 October, in  
the twenty-first year, as is said, whereof he is indicted or appealed, and  
of any consequent outlawry.

Aug. 17. Licence for John Bardolf of Wyrmegeye to grant to John de Wilton,  
Sandwich. knight, John de Berneye, William de Bergh, Adam de Shiryngham, John  
Auntrous and Geoffrey de Vernon, the manors of Whynebergh, Cauntele  
and Castre (10*l.* of rent in the last named manor excepted), which are  
said to be held in chief, to hold to them and their heirs, until they have  
levied therefrom 2000 marks due to them from him. By p.s.

Oct. 5. Pardon to John atte Broke of Foxherde of the king's suit for the death  
Westminster. of John de Hoketon of Cavendissh, whereof he is indicted or appealed,  
and of any consequent outlawry. By p.s.

Sept. 23. Grant for life to Robert Rotour, chaplain, of the chantry of the king's  
Clipstone. chapel within the manor of Clipston, with the chapel of St. Edwin within  
the forest of Shirewode; he taking for the chantry yearly by the hands of  
the sheriff of Nottingham as much as other chaplains, who have held the  
chantry, have been accustomed to take for the same. By p.s.
