Aug. 4. Pardon to Walter de Serleby of Wakfeld of the king's suit against him  
Westminster. for counterfeiting and falsifying his moneys of gold and silver, and of this  
that engines for making such false moneys were found in his keeping at  
Shrewsbury, and that he received John de Sendal, chaplain, notoriously  
charged with counterfeiting such moneys, whereof he is indicted or  
appealed; and of any consequent outlawries. By K. & C.

Aug. 6. Appointment of William Clewer, clerk of the king's ships, to purvey in  
Westminster. the counties of Kent and Sussex, 100 tuns of cider (*sicere*) for the munition  
of some ships putting to sea for certain causes, and to take carriage for  
the same to the place whither they are to be brought; with power to arrest  
and imprison all those whom he shall find rebellious herein. By K.

Aug. 5. Pardon to Richard Brasier of Wodeford, chaplain, of the king's suit for  
Henley. the death of Thomas de Northbrok, whom he killed by mischance, as is  
said, whereof he is indicted or appealed, and of any consequent outlawry.  
By p.s.

Aug. 7. Protection with clause *volumus*, until the quinzaine of Michaelmas, for  
Henley. the king's clerk, Master Paul de Monte Florum, who is bound to the king  
in a great sum to be paid on that date. By p.s.

Oct. 24. The like, until the quinzaine of Easter, for the same Paul.  
Westminster.

Aug. 12. Grant to Agnes de la Marche, in lieu of 10 marks at the exchequer  
Henley. yearly granted to her by letters patent, dated 19 February last, surrendered,  
of the said sum yearly out of the farm of the priory of Andewell, co.  
Southampton, for such time as the priory shall remain in the king's  
hands on account of the war with France, or until further order.

July 22. John Darcy of Knayth, staying in England, has letters nominating  
Westminster. Edmund Laurence and Peter de Wakefeld as his attorneys in Ireland for  
two years. The chancellor received the attorneys.

He has like letters nominating the same Edmund and William de  
Bromle, clerk, as above. The chancellor, &c.

July 12. Exemption, for life, of Robert son of Robert de Helewell, 'chivaler,' from  
Westminster. being put on assizes, juries or recognisances, and from appointment as  
taxer or collector of tenth, fifteenth or other subsidy granted to the king,  
arrayer or leader of men at arms, hobelers or archer, mayor, sheriff,  
coroner, escheator or other bailiff or minister of the king, against his  
will. By K.

July 17. Presentation of Richard de Capenhirst, chaplain, to the church of  
Westminster. Hope Maloyssel, in the diocese of Hereford, in the king's gift by reason  
of the priory of Monmouth being his hands on account of the war with  
France.

July 26. Presentation of Nicholas de Meriton, parson of the church of Werkton,  
Westminster. in the diocese of Lincoln, to the vicarage of the church of Curtlyngton,  
in the same diocese, in the king's gift by reason of the temporalities of  
the alien abbot of Aunay being in his hands as above; on an exchange of  
benefices with John de Hastynges.
