Feb. 12. Westminster. Commission of oyer and terminer to William Basset, Henry de Greystok, John Faucomberge of Bilton and Hillard de Usflet, on complaint by John de Botheby, parson of the church of Kayngham, that John Hildeverd, Peter, his brother, and Thomas 'Jonesservant Hildeverd,' at Drypole in Holderness, co. York, assaulted him and his servant William de Botheby, whereby he lost the service of the latter for a great time. By K.
- Feb. 15. Westminster. Mandate to all mayors, sheriffs, bailiffs, ministers and lieges to take and bring before the council all persons prosecuting appeals in derogation of the judgement of the court of Common Bench whereby the king recovered against John, bishop of Lincoln, his presentation to the prebend of Thurleby and Carleton, in the church of St. Mary, Lincoln.
- March 2. Westminster. The like with respect to the prebend of Bisshopeston, in the church of St. Mary, Salisbury, recovered against Robert, bishop of Salisbury, by like judgement.

- Feb. 10. Westminster. Prohibition to all ecclesiastical persons from proceedings in derogation of the judgement of the said court whereby the king recovered his presentation to the prebend of Thorp in the collegiate church of Houeden against the prior of Durham.
- May 11. Westminster. Commission to John Darcy, 'le fitz,' Richard de Hastynges, Thomas de Rokeby, Nicholas Gower and Richard de Seint Quyntyn to find by inquisition in the county of York the names of those who have forged there false metal of gold and silver and brought in the like forged elsewhere, and have counterfeited the king's dies for coining gold and silver money and brought other false money within the county, and of those who with guilty knowledge receive and maintain them; and to take and imprison all those indicted by the inquisitions and arrest also all such metal and money of those indicted, with their other goods. - Jan. 27. Westminster. Commission *de walliis et fossatis* to John de Colevill, knight, John de Pelham, William Muchet, James de Grancete and Hugh de Walton, in the towns of Dodyngton and Elme, co. Cambridge, and the parts adjacent.
- Feb. 18. Westminster. The like to John de Sutton of Holderness, Thomas de Seton, William de Skipwith and John de Wilton along the coast of the water of Humbre, between the towns of Hesel and Ravensere, and also along the coast of the water of Hull, between the towns of Beverley and Kyngeston upon Hull, co. York.
- Feb. 26. Westminster. Commission to John de Bray, Thomas Gerveys, Reynold de Neuport, Alexander de Babeham and Robert de Waltham, to enforce the acts of 25 Edward III [*Stat. 3, cap. 4*], and Edward I [*Stat. Westm. the Second, cap. 47*], in the water of Thames between London Bridge and Henlee Bridge, as that water flows by the counties of Middlesex and Berks, to survey all weirs, mills, stanks, stakes (*estachia*) and kiddles on the water and all nets put in the water, and to remove all obstructions to the passage of ships and boats there. - The like to them, on both sides of the water of Thames from London Bridge to Yenlade, as that water flows by the counties of Kent and Essex. By K.
