Safe-conduct, until Tuesday before the Nativity of the Blessed Mary, for Richard son of Simon, Roger de Langeberg, Maurice de Dunre, Thomas de Chedney, Peter de Middelton, Richard de Solariis, Alan Balistarius, men of Walter de Clifford, who were in the castle of Clifford, in the garrison thereof, in going through the king's land and returning.

Protection, without term, for Gerard, prior of Wassingburg.  
The like for W. bishop of Ossory.

Usk.

Protection, until Christmas, 19 Henry III, for Thomas de Berchamsted, burgess of Bristol.

Sept. 12.  
Hereford.

Royal assent to the election of Rowland, canon of St. Denys by Southampton, to be prior of that place; and mandate to the bishop of Winchester to do his part in this behalf.

Sept. 13.  
Leominster.

Safe-conduct, until Martinmas, for Mar[y], countess of Ponthieu, and those whom she brings with her, in coming to England on pilgrimage.

Sept. 13.  
Wigmore.

Appointment, during pleasure, of Henry de Trublevill to the custody of the castle of Usk; and mandate to J. de Monem[uta] and Nicholas de Molis to deliver it to him.

By the justiciary.

Sept. 16.  
Montgomery.

Safe-conduct, until Tuesday before St. Matthew the Apostle, for Walter de Clifford, and his men whom he will bring with him, in coming to the king to treat for his peace.

Presentation of William de Plessetis to the church of Eynford, in the king's gift by reason of the voidance of the archbishopric of Canterbury; directed to the official of the archdeacon of Canterbury.

Montgomery.

Licence for Robert le Mason (*Cementario*) of Muntgomery to make at his own charges a mill on a stream between the towns of Muntgomery and Dudinton, to hold in fee at a rent of 2 marks; saving to the king and his heirs free multure therein of the corn of his castle of Muntgomery.

Grant to the same Robert and his heirs of the king's windmill of Muntgomery without the castle of Muntgomery, to hold at a rent of 1 mark; saving to the king and his heirs free multure as above.
