- March 19. Appointment, during pleasure, of William de Lancastria to the custody of the honor of Lancastre; and mandate to all sheriffs in whose bailiwicks are lands or fees of that honor, not to intermeddle in those things which pertain to the honor. By the justiciary.
Oxford. Writ *de intendendo* directed to the tenants of the said honor.
- _____ Extension to the men of Worcester of the grant to them of murage, until Michaelmas in the nineteenth year.
- _____ Protection with clause *rogamus*, without term, for Robert de Chaugrave, keeper of the work of the bridge of Henle.
- March 24. Mandate to P. de Rivallis to deliver to Herbert son of Matthew the king's castle of Lydeford and forest of Dertemore, which the king has committed to his custody, during pleasure, to answer for the same at the Exchequer. By the justiciary and P. de Rivallis.
Kempton. Writ *de intendendo* to the tenants of the castellany and dwellers within the metes of the said forest.
- March 27. Mandate to the collectors of the fortieth in the county of Cornwall to cause what they have collected to be delivered without delay to the sheriff of Devon, whom the king has ordered to come to them at Lancaveton to receive it and carry it to Bruges Walteri and have it kept safely there until further order.
Westminster.
- April 1. Appointment for life of Brian de Insula to the castle and manor of Faversham. Bollesovre for his maintenance in the king's service; and mandate to W. Basset to cause him to have seisin thereof, saving to the king his stock and ploughs in the said manor, and to the same William his stock and ploughs therein. By K. before the justiciary.
- April 5. Safe-conduct, until Midsummer, for the men of Gant, coming to Canterbury. England to account with the king touching their debt to him, and to view how much they have paid thereof.
- April 7. Pardon to John son of Robert de Ingoldesthorp of the abjuration of the realm which he made for the death of Michael de Dersingham; with the usual conditions. For the lord of Canterbury.
- Exemption for life to Anketil Mallore from suits of shires, wapentakes, and trithings (*treiny'*) and from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions.
- April 11. Royal assent to the election of Hugh, Friar of the order of the Preachers, as bishop of St. Asaph; and mandate to E. archbishop of Westminster. Canterbury to do his part.
- Safe-conduct, until St. Peter's Chains, for Daniel de Inteberg coming to the king to speak with him.
- _____ Protection, without term, for the prior of Drax, for himself and his men. *Post pas'* by pledge of N. de Nevill.
- April 12. Restitution to John son of Geoffrey and Isabel his wife, of the castle and honor of Ewyas Lascy, which were assigned to her in dower of the lands late of Gilbert de Lascy, sometime her husband; and mandate to Drogo de Barentin to deliver the same to them.
Westminster. Writ *de intendendo* directed to the tenants of the said castellany and honor.
