Protection, until his return, for Nicholas de Molis, gone beyond seas as the king's envoy.

The like for Henry de Foscet[on], gone to him.

June 29.
Clarendon.

Appointment, during pleasure, of Simon de Norwico, king's clerk, to the custody of the abbey of Alnestowe, now void; and mandate to the tenants thereof to be intendant unto him.

July 1.
Clarendon.

Mandate to all constables and bailiffs late of G. Marshal, earl of Pembroke, in Ireland, because the earl is dead, to deliver forthwith all his castles and lands in their custody to the justiciary of Ireland, saving the right of anyone.

Notification to the constable of Strigoyll that the said earl is dead; and mandate to him to deliver that castle to J. de Munemue, to whose custody the king has committed it.

The like to the constables of Usk and Karlyun.

The like to the constable of Penbroc, Kaermeredin, Cardigan, and Kilgaran, committed to the custody of Hubert Huse.

Mandate to J. de Munemue to provide safe-conduct for Hubert Huse and his household as far as Penbroc.

The like to Mailgun son of Mailgun and Rees the younger.

The sub-prior and convent of St. Gregory's, Canterbury, have licence to elect a prior by S. the sub-prior, and R. the cellarer, of that house.

July 5.
Clarendon.

Mandate to the justiciary of Ireland to pay to William de Winceleys and William de Vilers, whom the king is sending to Ireland, 100s. for their expenses as a gift from the king.

July 3.
Clarendon.

Licence for Patrick de Chaurces to go to Normandy and stay there until Christmas, 26 Henry III.

Presentation of Master Hugh de Sancto Theoderio to the church of Hamsted, in the king's gift by reason of the lands late of G. Marshal, earl of Penbroc, being in his hands; directed to the bishop of Salisbury.

July 5.
Clarendon.

The prioress and convent of Alnestowe have licence to elect an abbess, by Agnes and Joan, nuns of the same place.

July 10.
Clarendon.

The prior and convent of Osolveston have licence to elect an abbot by R. the prior, and Alexander de Norhampton, a canon.

July 13.
Marlborough.

Mandate to the barons, knights and others of the counties of Chester, Salop and Stafford, to come in force when summoned on the king's behalf by John Lestrangle to defend the king's lieges of Wales against attack.

Licence for the prior and convent of Christchurch, Canterbury, to elect a father and pastor; renewed for the indemnity of them and their church.

_____ Royal assent to the election of Agnes de Westbiry, sub-prioress of Alnestowe, to be abbess of that house; and mandate to the bishop of Lincoln to do his part herein.

_____ Mandate to Simon de Norwico to give her seisin of the lands and possessions of the abbey.
