Oct. 28. Protection for the hospital of Holy Trinity, Ivelcestre, the master and
Westminster. brethren thereof and their men, during the minority of John le Daneys.

Oct. 29. Royal assent to the election of Walter de Benigwurth, monk of
Westminster. Bardenay, to be abbot of that house; and mandate to the tenants to be
intendant to him.

Writ of *liberate* to the treasurer and chamberlains to pay to Alvred Aloet, sometime serjeant of the king's sister Isabel, 50s. a year granted to him at the Exchequer for his maintenance.

Appointment of Master William le Brun with John Lestrangle, justice of Chester, or such person as the justice shall appoint in his place, to extend the king's demesne lands and manors in the county of Chester; and mandate to all tenants thereof to be attendant to them.

Mandate to the justiciary of Ireland to have the king's castle of Ganno safely guarded and fortified so far as necessary out of the issues of the land of Ireland; and the king will have the cost thereof allowed to him.

Oct. 30. Appointment, during pleasure, of John de Munemuth to the custody of
Westminster. the manors of Cardigan and Kaermerdin, with the counties and castles of the said manors.

Presentation of Robert de Coleham to the church of Bulewell; directed to the archbishop of York.

Appointment of Master Simon de Wauton as the king's proctor in the matter of the inquisition being taken between the king of the one party, by apostolic authority and the bishop of Bayonne, of the other party.

[Cancelled.] *Because the letters were surrendered.*

Nov. 3. Writ of *liberate* to the treasurer and chamberlains for 10*l.* a year granted
Westminster. to Reginald le Rus at the Exchequer of Michaelmas, until the king provide him with an equivalent of land in wards or escheats.

Nov. 4. H. earl of Essex and Hereford has surrendered to the king by his order
Westminster. the castle of Dover, which had been committed to his custody during pleasure; so that he and his heirs are quit of the said custody.

Exemption, for life, of John de Gatesden from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions; and he is to be quit of view of frankpledge, suits of counties and hundreds, and common summonses of justices in eyre whether for pleas of land or of the forest.

Mandate to John de Cobeham to deliver the castle of Rochester to Peter de Sabaudia, to whose custody the king has committed it, during pleasure; and acquittance to him and his heirs of the said custody.

Nov. 5. Presentation of William Laurence to the church of Chipping, void by
Westminster. the resignation of Master Peter Physicus; directed to Master J. archdeacon of Richmond.
