at St. Macaire, and for seizing part of the money of Bordeaux which he used to receive. All which sums of money the king has sworn by John de Grey, his knight, to pay at Paris or St. Denis before he returns dead or alive to England.

Notification that the king has acquitted the said archbishop of all fruits received by him up to the present from Mestrac and Camps with their appurtenances in Buch (*in Bogio*), and that the archbishop has acquitted the king of the fruits of the said places if it should happen that he come into possession of the said places against the king.

Restitution to the said archbishop and the chapter of St. Andrew's, Bordeaux, of what belongs to them by right in the money struck in the city of Bordeaux; and mandate to Stephen Bauzan to cause them to have seisin thereof.

Bond to Guy Peverel in 15 marks for a horse lost in the king's service, on testimony by John de Grey, and for 5 marks for a horse lost in the king's service at Landron; to be paid at Westminster on the quinzaine of Hilary next.

Pardon, at the instance of Master Gilbert de Milers, to Gregory son of Abel, sometime rector of the church of Cudenne, for the death of Thomas le Scut, whereof he was appealed in the county of Kent, and of any consequent outlawry.

The like to Adam son of William de Penre for the death of Richard de Kendale, whereof he was charged.

At the instance of Pelerin Sesmudi, merchant.

Exemption of Walter de Scoteny from being put on assizes, juries or recognitions, and from being made sheriff, coroner or other bailiff of the king, against his will.

Bond to Stephen le Engleys in 40*l.* of Bordeaux for targes, crossbows and steel helmets (*capell'is*) which he bought to the use of the king and delivered to Robert Walerand at the siege of the castle of Benages; to be paid at Bordeaux at All Saints next; and in 10 marks for a horse lost, on testimony by Drew de Barentin.

Vacated because otherwise in the pay roll (de paca).

Grant to Amanieu de le Bret of 50 marks a year at the exchequer of Easter, to maintain him in the king's service.

Charter granting to W. bishop of Worcester and his successors free warren in all his demesne lands of Hambiri in Salt Marsh (*in Salso Marisco*), Beybiri, Withendon, Clive, Bredon, Rippel, Kemeseye, Wike, Norwike, Hertlebiri, Alvinecherch, Fladebiri, Blockele, Tredinton, Stratford on Avon, Hampton Bishop, Eston and Rugges. Witnesses:—P. bishop of Hereford, Peter de Sabaudia, John son of Geoffrey, Ralph son of Nicholas, Peter de Monte Forti, Robert Walerand, John, Richard and William de Grey, brothers, Nicholas de Sancto Mauro, Imbert Pugeys, Ralph de Bakepuz and others.
